DISCUSSION IN RESPONSE TO LETTER FROM FIRE DEPARTMENT

Council agreed that we prepare a more accurate accounting of monies spent on Fire Department to prepare for a meeting with the Fire Department as soon as Pierre Zundle returns home from vacation. Council stated that we should show (in the diagram of a pie) just exactly what percentage Fire Department expenses are of our total budget, and also to show that we operated with a loss last year, and still have to recover from that loss.

The Volunteers are requesting that Village Council fund the complete amount of \$5,400 for the new tower for the radio's, and are quite unhappy that Council suggested that funds be taken from their recent revenue from the forest fire with Natural Resources.

RECYCLING IN STANLEY

Our service for bottle exchange has been terminated, as the gentleman that was doing the job for us stopped coming to Stanley, unbeknown to us. Our local MLA, Kirk MacDonald, agreed to investigate the situation, as Council thought that perhaps someone else might wish to obtain a license to do the job.

RCMP FACILITY IN STANLEY

MOTION: B. MACDONALD.

That Council have Clerk write a letter to RCMP Solicitor General, stating that we are very unhappy with the service that we have been receiving lately, and also to express the fact that we are very unhappy with the 2 new houses remaining vacant, and the RCMP Detachment which is vacant most of the time. This motion will be introduced at our next Council Meeting in August 1999.

ACTION: COUNCIL

Kirk MacDonald indicated to Council that he had various topics that he wanted to touch on, and asked that we raise any questions that we might have concerning each topic. They were as follows:

D.O.T.

Kirk advised stated that Stanley Hill will be completed at a cost of \$200,000-\$250,000, \$180,000 to be spent on Royal Road, \$100,000 to go to Rte. 107 towards Napadogan, and \$400,000 to be spent on the English Settlement Road, with \$50,000 to be spent this year, and the remainder in time to come.

He advised Council that Ms. Blaney requests that we prepare a 5-year plan, with our wishes prioritized in order of need; Council agreed that this would be Rte. 107 leading to Cross Creek.

Signage - he stated that he has requested a few more signs indicating how to get to Stanley, and a sign will be put up at MacLaggan Bridge, indicating that it is indeed MacLaggan Bridge.

WALKING TRAIL

He advised that Gilles Bernier is still investigating and exploring with CN as to how CN acquired title to the ground, etc.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

He mentioned that our area is in need of creation of jobs with suggestions being textiles, call centers, plastics, special care homes, etc. He explained about the IV Bags.

FREDERICTON AIRPORT

He indicated that the US want to set up a flight between Fredericton and US, and that the Canadian Airlines do not want to continue doing business in Fredericton.

UNCONDITIONAL GRANT FORMULA

He stated that the City of Fredericton has taken the initiative by requesting a hold or freezing of funding levels at 199 figures, with the support of the government and cabinet.

NASHWAAK VILLA

He suggested that the Village Council write a letter asking that the Villa increase their beds from 30 to 34.

EDUCATION

Kirk mentioned that he has received complaints about the lack of disciplinary action at the Stanley High School, and complaints about the principal, Mr. A. Atkins. He suggested that Village Council write a letter to the Minister stating that we have many young qualified teachers in the area who should be given consideration for teaching positions.

NEWSPAPER ADVERTISING

He advised that a lady who started a Bed and Breakfast in the Tay Creek area is our correspondent for The Daily Gleaner; he was not sure of her name.

JEFF CHAMBERLAIN SCHOOL

He briefly discussed this service which has been very beneficial to the area.

Our meeting concluded with Birthday Cake in honor of Councillor Mark Foreman's 40th birthday, effective August 3rd. Meeting adjourned at approximately 10:30 p.m.
