4 **R C M P REPORT**

6 **SENIOR'S COMPLEX ON STANLEY HILL**

Councillor B. MacDonald advised Council that all remaining tenants will be moving in this week-end. The Village have received the bill for pipe, couplings, elbows, etc. amounting to \$2,299.43 from Sandale Utility Products Inc, but Councillor MacDonald stated that there is a considerable amount of pipe, etc. to be returned that was not used. Clerk will contact Day & Ross to request that they pick it up and return it.

We also received a bill from Hoyt's Septic Services Ltd. for \$1,012.00. Have not received a bill from Logan Drilling yet for the drilling.

Councillor B. MacDonald asked who is responsible for the curbing? Clerk will check the files to see if Lloyd Wilson looked after it when he built his new house on the hill, or if the Village were

responsible for same, and Clerk will advise Councillor MacDonald.

Clerk stated that it is costing the Village dollars to continue to leave her account in the computer utility billing with service charges, etc. as she will never pay, never has paid anything on it, and never will now, especially since the house is now in a dilapidated condition. Council decided to wait until Mayor Ross was present before making a decision as to what to do.

Foreman suggested that a letter be sent out to the High School and to residents within the Village, indicating to them the approximate dollars it costs the Village to replace the damages, and stating that if the vandalism continues in the future, the Village will no longer be able to support organizations within the Village such as Safety Seminar, Graduation Prizes, and other donations that are annually given. It is important for them to realize that even though we acquire many things through government funding programs, it is our responsibility to maintain them, and at the present with the recent damages, costs are very high. It was suggested that this letter might be sent out with a Sewage Billing. This will be further discussed at next month's meeting.
