CANADA DAY PARADE

We agreed to plan to have a float with a "Stanley Village Park" setting. This would include acquiring a trailer bed (8' x 12' approximately) and we plan to display two artificial trees, trim the branches with two shades of green blown-up balloons, purchase flooring turf to cover the float to appear as green grass, construct a fence, have a blanket on the floor, a picnic basket, possibly a swing on a rope, a banner to read "Stanley Village Council" and a sign to read "STANLEY VILLAGE PARK".

MEETING WITH KIRK MACDONALD, MLA

Councillor Mark Foreman joined us for this meeting.

Signage

Council suggested to Kirk the need for signs indicating directions to Stanley at the following locations:

- Mouth of Killarney Road on Route 8;
- Nashwaak Bridge where the Irving Convenience Store had been;
- Taymouth - By the bridge, leading up the back road;
- Intersection of Cross Creek and Williamsburg.

Council also advised him that we need street signs including:

- Water Street (1)
- River Street (1)
- Bridge Street (2)
- Main Street (2)
- Irishtown Road (2)
- Glen Road

Council also mentioned that the Village Sign in English Settlement has disappeared.

Kirk suggested that Council write a letter to Margaret Ann Blaney indicating that we are requesting these signs.

Summer Students

He advised Council that we will receive two summer students through the S.E.E.D. program.

Unconditional Grant

He stated that there is a new formula in the works, and Stanley will be much better off as a result of it. It should be in place by fall before budget time.

Road Work

He stated that the possibility of chip sealing the remainder of English Settlement Road is Priority # 1 (\$550,000); he hopes to get \$100,000 this year. Also mentioned that North Tay Road and secondary roads including Red Rock and Currieburg are on the list. He stated that there will not be any asphalt road done this year.

Airport

\$16-20 million dollars needed, city of Fredericton is willing to contribute somewhat. Plan to extend the runway.

Visitor Information Center

This will likely be located at King's Landing.

Call Center

they have asked for more information for Doaktown and McAdam. They were concerned that we were too close to Fredericton, but haven't given up on Stanley yet, and still have not chosen a location.

Agriculture

He stated that he felt the cuts were too deep.

Education

He stated that there is an extra \$19 million for Education, and that the Durham school area will get more funds.

Council thanked Mr. MacDonald for attending and for bringing us up to date on various topics.
