11 **VERNON MERRILL - HORSES**

Vernon was present at Council Meeting and requested permission to pasture his horse behind the house on his property at 120 Giants Glen Road, Stanley, N.B. E6B 1S7. He stated that he would only be pasturing it there until late fall, when he would take it out to his mother's property in Maple Grove for the winter months. He also stated that his livelihood depends on his horse.

MOTION: It was moved that Council allow Vernon Merrill to house his horse at his property at 120 Giants Glen Road, Stanley, N.B. (506 367-2499).

Council advised Vernon that a letter will be prepared for his signature regarding the above and will read as follows:

“Stanley Village Council have agreed to allow your property at 120 Giants Glen Road to be zoned as RA (Residential Agriculture) in accordance with our Zoning By-Law # 25, Section 48, Subsection (1). This agreement will remain in effect as long as Vernon Merrill is the lessee owner of the property.”

12 **SEPTIC SYSTEM - MARSHA & NICKY PALMER**

Clerk will compose a letter to The Palmers with a copy to Stephanie Shotter of Environment (444-4411) to advise that they cannot connect to the Village Sewage System due to their location, as our System does not include the Ward Settlement Road, and it also not possible to connect to another user's line. Therefore, it is necessary for them to comply with provincial guidelines for septic systems and fields. Council decided to give them one month to comply with the request. As the former dwelling never had a sewage system of any kind, it is even more crucial that the new dwelling have an approved system.

ANDREW ROSS - ONGOING PROBLEM OF VANDALISM

Andrew was present at Council Meeting and presented his thoughts and Step 1 of his plan to improve the situation of vandalism in the Stanley area. He listed his possible reasons for vandalism in this area which included:

- Lack of structural recreational programs;
- Drug & Alcohol;
- Absence of Position Role Models;
- Fear of Change in Population;
- Lack of response or tolerance for at-risk youth;
- Absence or reluctance to take on leadership roles.

Mayor Foreman advised that we would rather be a supporter of any new suggestions or plans, as opposed to being the instigator. Andrew suggested that we need more communications – via the Internet, Web Site, Web Page, etc., etc. He stated that St. Thomas University are eager to help at-risk students. Much discussion took place concerning possible improvements, and Council agreed that Andrew contact Kevin Weilley (composer of our proposed Stanley Newspaper) about possibly having it in the newspaper.



