Sidewalks	10,000.

Clerk will indicate that we either do one of the 3 projects or a part of each one.

Clerk will also prepare a letter for Kirk MacDonald, our MLA, to submit for recreation and park funding. **ACTION: CLERK**

29 **STANLEY MUSIC CENTER - PHILLIP MCGEEHAN**

Phillip McGeehan was present at our meeting and talked with Council about his present situation, and how the community has benefitted from the Music Center, asking Council if they think the community will suffer if it is no longer in business, as he cannot afford to pay rent when he is not receiving any revenue. Council agreed on the following:

Ask Phillip McGeehan to store his equipment in the two small rooms off the large room, although he may move it out into the large room for practice, etc., but that we plan to use the large room as a community room, making it available space for other groups. We will waive the debt that he owes for rent, but will ask that he sign a waiver stating that we are not responsible for his equipment in the event of theft or damage. Also, we will ask that either he or some adult appointed by him be present when the space is being occupied by another group. There is to be no smoking, no drinking, and no loitering. He may also want to purchase some liability insurance protection for himself and his equipment.

RECENT VANDALISM IN THE AREA



Reports are being received about tremendous damage in the area on the week-end. Council asked Clerk to call the Oromocto detachment and advise, asking what can be done about it.
