11 **RANDY CASEY**

He was present to our meeting and agreed to work under contract for the Village of Stanley as Dog By-Law Enforcement Officer. Council agreed to have a separate telephone line installed that would only ring in on Mr. Casey's line in Fredericton (459-7831). He agreed to work for the Village for \$125.00 per month retainer to include evenings and week-ends, plus mileage under a contract from June 1, 2004 to May 31, 2004; contract to be renewed annually. Also to include \$15/hour. Mr. Casey's address is 1801 Rte 655, Nasonworth, NB E3B 8G1. He works as By-Law Enforcement Officer for the Village of New Maryland and asked us to get a copy of their By-Law and suggested that we might wish to amend our By-Law to include additional clauses. Also, Clerk will check with New Maryland to see where they had their Offence Tickets printed, and she will order tickets for us so that Mr. Casey can deliver these tickets to those dog owners who have not yet purchased dog licenses. Clerk will prepare a contract for Mr. Casey's signature as well as compose a list of civic addresses of those who will be fined. He stressed that we have a Leash Law included in our by-law; impoundment fees to a maximum of 72 hours, puppies - after 3 months.
