Cst. Victor Dray stopped by later in the evening and discussed with Council progress made on the break-in's at several camps in the area. Suspects were discussed at length and the frustration as to what can be done to prevent such things from happening. Neighbourhood Watch was discussed; enacting a curfew was suggested by Cst. Dray; plans to have Victor do a presentation at the school on Drug Awareness and Alcohol; Mayor Foreman mentioned establishing community involvement for youth at the gym at the school in the evenings and on week-ends. Cst. Dray advised that they had caught 47 people not wearing seatbelts in the area.


