

SPECIAL MEETING OF STANLEY VILLAGE COUNCIL
TUESDAY, OCTOBER 10, 2007

ACCEPTANCE OF TENDER FOR INSTALLATION OF CONCRETE FLOOR AT FIRE HALL – TAMARACK LANE BUILDERS

MOTION: B. MACDONALD / R. STOREY / CARRIED.

MOTION: Village Council accepts the tender in the amount of \$6,413.64 from Tamarack Lane Builders for the above work.

CONVERSATION WITH BARRY NASON CONCERNING VACANT BLDG.

Clerk advised Council that she spoke with Mr. Nason this afternoon and asked if he had given any consideration to the proposal from the Village in regards to the demolition of his building. Village Council had originally offered him \$5,000 if he would tear it down and removal the debris. Mr. Nason stated that he would be agreeable to that but would require an extra \$2,000 for removal of the basement. Clerk will check with him to see if that would include hauling away the remains of the basement and filling in the hole.

VARIOUS TOPICS DISCUSSED WITH KIRK MACDONALD, MLA

Former DNR Office – he advised that there are two other parties interested in the building – 1) Paul Humble and 2) Heather & Shawn Sampson. Council is going to go through the building and make a decision following the viewing. Kirk also stated that he had spoken with Tom Cameron at Stanley High School who stated that he would be willing to have two of his Shop Classes do any kind of carpentry renovations to any buildings in the village that might be available for improvements. Both buildings belonging to Dr. David Wagener and David Wagener, Jr. would meet these needs, if they were agreeable to spend monies for supplies. The Shop Classes would do the labor free of charge. Kirk will contact Dr. Wagener.

MAP – JOHN MACGILLIVRAY

He has a map dated back in 1944 of the Nashwaak area – crown land – all the roads, etc. – and he would like to give it to the community to be portrayed in a public place. It is about 80” x 98” in size. It would be displayed under Plexiglas. He asked Council if they would like to display it in the Village Office and Council agreed that it would be nice on the left wall as you enter the office. Kirk stated that he could get some financial assistance and at the present is getting a price from Earl Gilbey (framer). Kirk stated that the map would be twice the size of the boardroom table.

REQUEST FOR ANY AVAILABLE PROPERTY IN THE VILLAGE

Kirk stated that Jerry Tozer (X-Treme Marine) advised him that there might be 2 or 3 smaller companies that might come to Stanley to set up if they could share a building (incubator model) – cost-sharing in services such as heat, snow removal, etc. Businesses that might be interested are a metal working business and a pottery business. It was suggested that the former DNR building might suit the bill.

VENEER MILL IN NAPADOGAN

Kirk mentioned the fact that this mill, being the only veneer mill in Atlantic Canada, closed officially about a month ago as they could not acquire the wood that they needed. However, in Maine, a cousineau group was found who said that they will buy 2/3 of everything that Veneer Products could produce, and he stated that the mill could produce almost exclusively dye products. He advised that the cousineau group is spending four days there this week and dye tests are being done this week-end. A Board of Directors has been formed including representatives from NB Power, Pierre Zundel, Kenneth Thomas, David Palmer, Robert Armstrong (former DNR employee) and Carol Labillois. Target Date for Restart is proposed to be November 15, 2007.

PELLET MILL BUILDING – NASHWAAK BRIDGE

He advised that over half a million dollars has been given towards the Pellet Mill – new building in Nashwaak Bridge. They need a response within a week to 2 weeks. Their next meeting is set for Monday Night, October 22, 2007. A week's salary would amount to approximately \$22,000.

CENOTAPH

Kirk mentioned that most plaques at the cenotaphs in New Brunswick include World War I veterans, but many of those who served in World War II who came back alive never got their names on the stones. Kirk spoke with Jerry Tozer who stated that he could do it on steel and would be interested in doing one for Stanley at cost. Barbara MacDonald stated that she had a blank application form for funding and agreed that she would get Kirk to help her to get it filled out. Kirk mentioned that Hartland are accessing the dollars this year, and the government is hoping that Stanley would get the financial assistance in 2008.
