Discussion Topics:

Gate at Apt. #1; Lorna Pinnock –Sick Time/Employment

Gate at Apt. #1:

Large rocks have been placed on the lane between MacDonald's residence and the Walking Trail in an attempt to curtail ATV/bike traffic. Tenant A. Dorcas reports the bikes are spinning up her driveway and still passing through. T. Hunter will price some farm gates to erect at the apartment and perhaps on the lane where the rocks are presently.

Lorna Pinnock –Sick Time/Employment

Council had requested a meeting with Lorna Pinnock to discuss her plans for her return to work. L. Pinnock did not feel up to attending but forwarded information by letter and a verbal discussion with S. D. Bartlett.



S. D. Bartlett reported that L. Pinnock indicated she has applied for a Disability Pension through Canada Pension however, she was told it could take up to November 1st, 2010 before she hears whether or not she is eligible for this. She calculated her sick time based on $\frac{3}{4}$ days per month part-time employment; (entitled to 1.5 days per month full time employment) 23 years x 9 or 217 days. She has used only 63.5 during those years up to and including August 2010, leaving her with 153.5 days remaining.

L. Pinnock indicated to S. D. Bartlett that she felt she would like to start back to work one day a week, preferably a Monday, and do some typing and filing, etc. but did not feel she was able at this time to take on any more responsibility than that. Council discussed this at great length and with Lorna's health first and foremost in their thoughts decided it would not be advisable for her to return to work in this capacity, that is not at her regular duties, at this point in time.

L. Pinnock discussed with S. D. Bartlett that if Council was not agreeable to her returning as she suggested, if Council would be willing to continue to pay her her regular salary until she has confirmation for her pending Disability claim or the end of the year, which ever comes first, and to discuss further options at that point. Council was agreeable to this and also thought it prudent on their part to contact Solicitor, J. Wilby to protect L. Pinnock's interests as well as the Village of Stanley's interests in this matter.
