

***SPECIAL MEETING OF STANLEY VILLAGE COUNCIL***

***Discussion Topic:***

***Meeting with Peter Kavanaugh and Fire Department to discuss boundaries / Brush Cutting – Harrison Avenue, Lagoon Road, Road to Lift Station / Adult Learning Facility – 17 Giants Glen Road***

A special meeting was to be held with Peter Kavanaugh to discuss the area the SVFD are presently servicing and the present LSD assessment. Unfortunately, Mr. Kavanaugh's office advised the Friday before this meeting that he was on vacation until October 25<sup>th</sup>, and would not be attending this meeting.

Council and the SVFD members discussed the territory currently covered and serviced by the department, but that cuts off at a certain point and is covered by other fire departments:

- Route 625 to the tracks on the Campbellton Road
- Route 8 to McGivney
- Route 620 to Wilkins before Hamptown Corner
- Route 107 to the White Road before Juniper
- English Settlement Road to power lines
- Upper Woodland Road

Presently the SVFD does not cover Nashwaak Bridge. Nashwaak Valley Department is servicing that area to South Portage. Rural Miramichi is covering South Portage toward Boiestown. Stanley has a shorter distance and time response than Nashwaak Valley or Rural Miramichi has.

Cross Creek Station road - SVFD now goes to the tracks – but should, due to shorter distance and time response, go to the Legion on Route 8 – clear to South Portage.

SVFD should also cover the Lower Woodland Road rather than Keswick, again for distance and response times.

Captain Colford suggested perhaps consideration should be given to splitting the cost of a dry hydrant with the Keswick Department on Route 620 to service the Woodland areas.

Council also discussed with SVFD members that if any territory has to be given up it should be in the Napadogan to White Road area and that perhaps Juniper Department take that over. Council will be requesting another meeting with Mr. Kavanaugh and asked that Captain Colford and Mr. Foreman be present at that meeting.

Council also discussed with Captain Colford the request made by Department Member K. Lyons for payment of his Level 4 Investigation course in the amount of \$550.00. Captain Colford provided Council with documentation verifying Mr. Lyons was already provided payment for this course back in April 2010. Council will wait for a copy of the cancelled draft from the Department prior to addressing the matter with Mr. Lyons.

Captain Colford indicated that they are low on base operators and that even if they went with the provincial dispatch system, a base operator would still be required to record information. Discussion was had over the purchase of a digital recorder being placed on the Fire Department telephone which would pick up the tones of a fire call and record the call information. The Department may also program their radios to the EMO Tower which will allow them to speak to any dispatch in the province.

Captain Colford also advised Council that Chief Colford fell off the roof of his barn and has broken vertebrae in his back. He will be laid up for some time and will probably take a leave of absence from the Department and appoint Captain Colford as interim Chief. The members of the SVFD left the meeting with Council's thanks.

***Brush Cutting – Harrison Avenue, Lagoon Road, Road to Lift Station***

Peter Ross of V & P Construction will be contacted again to see if he can do the required brush cutting on Harrison Avenue, the lagoon road, and the road to the lift station behind Stanley Mutual.


***Adult Learning Facility – 17 Giants Glen Road***

Council discussed the request from Tara Grey at Central Valley Adult Learning for the Stanley Adult Learning Centre. They are looking for a donation of office space. The Centre will incur the cost of set up, electricity and heating costs. They would require the space long term and set up at least four computer stations. They would be open 36.25 hours per week, 5 days a week (open one weekend day). An employee would be at the Centre full time.

Council felt this could be a possibility if the Centre was agreeable to a year to year lease. S. D. Bartlett will contact Ms. Grey to discuss.
