

Thursday, February 29, 1950

The February Meeting of the Stanley Village Council was held in the Council Chamber with Mayor John Mac Gillivray presiding. Meeting opened with a prayer for Civic Authorities.

Minutes were read and approved on a motion from Councillor Munn seconded by Councillor Snrson.

Fire Chief Melvin Bissett, fireman Jerome Kennedy and Volunteer fireman Dexter Chaffey were in attendance. On behalf of Stanley Mutual Fire Insurance, Jimmy Linwood, secretary - treasurer, presented the fireman with a cheque for \$100. This was to show appreciation for work done by Stanley's Fire Fighting Force.

Fire Chief Bissett presented several letters to the Council. One was from the office of the Fire Marshall inquiring about a fire prevention by-law. Clerk was instructed to write to that office for further information.

Another letter concerned the Maritime Fire Chiefs Convention to be held in Fredericton in July. It was moved by Councillor Munn and seconded by Councillor Mac Naughton that \$25.00 should be sent to support this.

A letter was read from the N.B. Fire Chiefs Assoc. On a motion from Councillor Snrson, seconded by Councillor Munn the Clerk was instructed to send the Association dues of \$20. After more discussion of fire related subjects the members of the Fire Fighting Force.

Councillor Snrson reported that the Senior Citizens of Durham Bridge were now trying to get the hope Orange Hall moved to the burn site for a new Senior Citizens Recreation Hall so he doubted that they'd want Stanley Institute Hall. However, it was decided that Mayor Mac Gillivray and Councillor Mac Naughton should attend the next <sup>meeting</sup> and explain to the ladies that the Hall might be sold.

Councillor Snrson stated that no member of the Dept. of Municipal Affairs could offer any help about Stanley's dog problem.

A letter from Snrson on Jerry Kennedy was read concerning pay raises and benefits. It was moved by Councillor Snrson and seconded

by Councillor Munn that there be 24 pay days a year for the fireman. Carried.

It was moved by Councillor Munn and seconded by Councillor Mac Naughton that his yearly pay for fireman be increased from \$1200 per annum to \$250. per annum and retro-active to January 1, 1950. Carried.

Clerk was asked to write a letter informing Mr. Kennedy that the Village could not pay him for Sewage Maintenance until a cash flow is established.

St. John Ambulance asked for financial assistance. After some discussion <sup>this request</sup> ~~it~~ was ~~settled~~ settled on a motion from Councillor Sanson seconded by Councillor Munn.

Possible danger of flooding behind the Post Office was discussed. Councillor Mac Naughton will keep ~~the~~ watch on the situation.

<sup>mayor Mac Dillivray</sup> ~~John~~ invited Council to a meeting of the Capital Regional Development Commission where Dr. R. P. Potter - expert in mining will speak on Thursday, March 6, 1950.

Clerk was instructed to send a letter of thanks to Stanley Mutual Fire Insurance on behalf of Council & firemen.

Councillor Mac Naughton wondered if there is a solution to the double parking problem by York Ave. Market Products building. Clerk was instructed to write P. C. M. P. Sgt. Barnstead telling him of the problem and to ask for help in solving it.

Meeting adjourned on a motion from Councillor Sanson
