

Wednesday, January 10, 1980.

Regular monthly meeting of the Stanley Village Council was held in the Council Chamber with Mayor John Mc Gillivray in the chair.

The meeting opened with a prayer for Civic Authorities

Minutes from December 12 were read and approved on a motion from Councillor ~~Sans~~ Mac Naughton and seconded by Councillor Munn.

Minutes from December 20 were read and approved on a motion from Councillor Sansom and seconded by Councillor Munn.

The Senior Citizens Club in Durham Budge burned to the ground on December 23, 1979. Since then the Durham Budge senior citizens have shown an interest in purchasing Stanley Institute Hall. After a discussion on the subject Councillor Sansom made the following motion: That Council tentatively accept the proposal from the Durham Budge Senior Citizens to buy the Institute Hall and that a delegation from Council should visit the Women's Institute meeting to explain the offer. Motion was seconded by Councillor Munn. Carried.

It was decided that the fire truck until to the Village of Millville should be started when they first took it away. They got it to Millville, found it wouldn't go in the garage so brought it back. They intend to make some repairs to the fuel tank and take the truck back soon.

It was decided to charge budget construction to rent for the month of December since they occupied the rink until December 21.

Councillor Munn had a report from the Recreation Council. They are doing well on their own but would like a donation from Council.

Clerk was asked to write a letter to Clifford MacKinnon and to quote the by-law regarding dogs. Also to post a copy of the by-law in the Post Office. Clerk was also <sup>asked to</sup> ask in Dept. of Municipal Affairs to see if there is any possibility of getting a dog catcher beam to Stanley.

Site of truck building is an unsightly nuisance. Councillor Sansom said he would ask about liens on property at Municipal Office.

Mayor Mc Gillivray said he would try to get the Honorable David Bishop to come to the February Council Meeting.

Council decided to send a letter to the households to explain that Tax Assessment base was \$3,828,760 in 1979 and \$5,374,220 in 1980.

Council decided to have Eva Rogerson take their picture in February.

Meeting adjourned on a motion by Councillor Munn.
