Thursday, June 12, 1980.

The regular meeting of the Stanley Village Council was held in the Council Chamber at 7.30 p.m. with Mayor John Mac Gillivray presiding.

Two representatives of the Stanley Recreation Council were present. They opened the possibility of the Recreation Council obtaining the deed to the park. They also requested money for a parade on July 1. Council later decided to allot \$175.00 for this purpose.

The regular meeting opened with a prayer for Civic Authorities.

Minutes were read and approved on a motion from Councillor Mac Naughton seconded by Councillor Sanson.

Mayor Mac Gillivray that a not too successful meeting with the Department of Transportation had been held. Councillor Sanson reported that there is a committee from the Association of Villages to work with regarding Department of Transportation troubles.

Oil tender question was tabled until the next meeting.

Council discussed the Fire Fighting Force and decided that when a fire is out, the Forces responsibility ends.

Councillor Sanson reported that water would be pumped into the lagoon to see if there is a leak.

Easement # 2 without Herb Currie's permission

Blocked culvert at house Mac Oloone.

Mac Gillivray's culvert & those across his road are blocked off.

It was decided that, due to unforeseen business, another meeting will be held on Thursday June 19, 1950.

Councillor Sansom moved that the meeting be adjourned.
