

Thursday, March 13, 1980.

The monthly meeting of the Stanley Village Council was held in the Council Chambers with Mayor John Mac Gillivray in the chair.

The meeting opened with a prayer for Civic Authorities.

The minutes were read and approved on a motion by Councillor Mac Naughton, seconded by Councillor Sanson.

Councillor Mac Naughton reported that there was no immediate danger of flooding behind the Post Office and that he was keeping it watched.

Mayor Mac Gillivray & Councillor Sanson attended the meeting of the Capital Regional Development Commission on March 6, 1980. ^{A copy of} The speech made by Dr. P. Lottor about New Brunswick minerals was tabled for Council.

Mr. Milburn, from N.B. Tel had been speaking with Councillors Mac Naughton and Sanson regarding a petition being circulated in the Village asking that Stanley be put on the Fredericton Exchange. This is not likely to be done in the near future, but Mr. Milburn assured the Councillors that he would ^{give} greater publicity to the Commission in the Village. Such a plan offers a reduced rate to two out of four long distance places - Fredericton, Millville, Keswick or Bristow.

Letters were read from Sheila & Tom Dunphy and from Ann Marie & Keith Gorman with requests for streetlights. Clerk reported that cost had risen in the past year by \$9.40 for 49 lights and by \$13.45 for two others. Councillor Sanson moved that Mayor Mac Gillivray appoint a committee to consider lights in the Village with the possibility of re-distribution or addition of street lights and that the clerk answer requests for lights with an explanation of what council is doing. Councillor Munro seconded the motion. Carried. Mayor appointed Councillors Mac Naughton and Munro to serve on the committee.

Clerk was asked to write a letter to the N. B. C. P. C. asking if other Villages follow a certain procedure in erecting street lights.

Mayor McKinnis had asked Mayor Mac Gillivray if the Village of Stanley would support the City of Sudbuckton with its bid for the Summer Games. Council decided that they could offer moral help but no financial help.

The Capital Regional Development Commission, approached Mayor Mac Gillivray, is presently forming a committee to approach to various municipalities just what it has to offer. Mayor Mac Gillivray suggested that Council could hold a meeting with these men comparable with the one held with the R.C.M.S. last fall.

Councillor Sanson reported to Council that the deeds for the Institute Hall and the Park, are registered under the Women's Institute and the Park under the Recreation Council. It was moved by Councillor Sanson, seconded by Councillor Mac Naughton that Mayor Mac Gillivray appoint a committee to look into the matter. Carried. The Mayor asked Councillor Sanson & the clerk to do so.

Councillor Sanson reported that he had heard no word from Mr. Fisher or Mr. Inman about a Sewage Bond Issue.

Councillor Munn reported that Stanley Recreation Council is involved with groups of people who wish to form the Upper Nishnabask Recreation Council, and in the near future they want to send a delegation to Council to discuss this matter.

Councillor Munn moved that the meeting be adjourned.
