

Thursday, May 8, 1980.

The regular monthly meeting of the Stanley Village Council was held in the Council Chambers with Mayor John Mac Gillivray presiding.

The meeting opened with a prayer for Civic Authorities and adopted

The minutes were read, ~~and~~ corrected, ^{and adopted} on a motion from Councillor Mac Naughton seconded by Councillor Sansom.

On a motion from Councillor Sansom, seconded by Councillor Mac Naughton it was decided that Mayor Mac Gillivray will attend the Annual Meeting of the Provincial Association of Villages in Grand Bend on June 5 & 6.

It was reported by Councillor Mac Naughton that the Cross Creek Pink Shuck had been seen, but not to the Stanley Recreation Council.

Blek stated that letters were sent from both the Village & the Dept. of Environment to Mr. Gill and Mrs. Miles about dumping raw sewage in the dump.

Nothing has yet to be done by the Road Supervisor regarding road signs. Mayor Mac Gillivray is going to try to get some reaction from the Dept. of Transportation again by going to the top through the proper channels.

Oil tenders were read from Mr. Mosley and Mr. Dorcas. Blek was asked to contact Mr. Mosley about care and cleaning.

Mr. Kenney and Mr. Bartlett were at Council representing the Fire Department with several requests.

It was moved by Councillor Sansom and seconded by Councillor Mac Naughton that fees for Volunteer Fire Fighters and Councillors be paid by the Village for a St. John Ambulance Basic Emergency course to be held in the Village Saturday, June 14, 1980.

It was moved by Councillor Sansom and seconded by Councillor Mac Naughton that Mr. Bartlett and Mr. Kenney be reimbursed for any expenses which they might have while attending the P.B. convention of fire chiefs in Newcastle on Saturday, May 17.

Mr. Kenney announced that Clause I of the Fire

Fighting House would be held in August and those IV in October. Council gave him permission to attend.

Councillor Sansom moved and Councillor Mac Naughton seconded that an inventory be made of all equipment located in the fire hall and that the inventory be co-signed by Mr. Kennedy and Mr. Bissett.

Council discussed the report of grass fires taking place & the cost entailed. It was decided to bring the matter up in January 1981 with the possibility of writing a By-Law.

A request has been made by the Senior Citizens for Council to pay for their Sewage Hook-Up & charge them only \$60 annually for use. Council feels that no exceptions can be made regarding fees and hook-ups but is willing to find out if there is government assistance available.

Councillor Sansom is suspicious that there might be a leak in the lagoon.

Council decided that Brandell and Associates should supply a technician for Village Sewage clean-up instead of using Mr. Kandy.

Councillor Mac Naughton moved that \$100 damages be paid to Raughter & Winnipeg Police for sewage damage. This request has been made from Council, ^{which} lawyers & Brandell and Associates. Councillor Sansom seconded the motion.

Councillor Mac Naughton gave a report on a recent Operation Council meeting he attended because Councillor Munn was away.

The meeting was adjourned on a motion from Councillor Mac Naughton.
