

The meeting opened with a prayer for Civil Authority. Council decided second request toward sewage payment should be sent on May 1, 1981. A letter was prepared for mailing.

A letter to the Agricultural Society from the Department of Health regarding sewage hook-ups was read. Councillor Sansom reported talking to Mary Belliveau - public health inspector who seemed very helpful.

Mayor Mac Gillivray reported that the Village Beautification Project was going well & that almost all of the trees, proposed for cutting, were down.

Clerk was asked to get in touch with Fritchey Bartlett to see if a letter has been written to Stanley Mutual thanking them for their \$150 donation.

Councillor Mac Naughton said that he had been talking to Fritchey Bartlett about a first aid course for Kennebec Base. It was moved by Councillor Mac Naughton and seconded by Councillor Sansom that the Village make funds available for this course.

\* Councillor Mac Naughton mentioned the fact that there are tentative plans to build a house behind Glenwood Dorcas. If this is so a road to the property will be the responsibility of the people concerned.

Councillor Sansom mentioned that Fritchey Bartlett had \$300 outstanding on a debt for the purchase of fire equipment that he had with Jerry Kennedy & wondered if Council would take on the responsibility & obligation. Councillor Sansom will have further details at the next meeting.

Waeter Dorcas & Miss Hinnoch attended the meeting on behalf of the Agricultural Society.

They inquired about several subjects. Councillor Sansom offered to try to get help for Sewage hook-ups. Council offered to work with the Agricultural Society to meet with the P.C.M.S. Council will see how long the Village holds a lease on the H.K. Sansom park.
