

Thursday, August 13, 1981

Regular monthly meeting of the Stanley Village Council was held in the Council Chambers with Mayor John MacGillivray in the chair.

The meeting opened with a prayer for Civic Authorities.

The minutes were ^{read} and approved on a motion from Councillor Sansom seconded by Councillor Britany.

Men from the Department of Highways are currently working on the Hill. Mayor MacGillivray and Councillor Sansom have been talking to them and storm sewers are the main concern. Mr. McFagen has ~~gone~~ ^{yet} to confer with Mayor and Council.

Councillor Britany stated that a cable had not yet been put on the Park Gate but he would see if something could be done before Fair Time.

Councillor Sansom reported that Chubi's Restaurant James Lorn, with Chubi's co-operation had been declared to be O.K. by the Fire Marshall and the Mounties. Chub still has no permit from the Village.

Village has received a Stimulation Grant of \$8,000 Council will ask for another estimate on work for the library.

The back building basement has yet to be cleaned up and the owner, Mr. Mason, is supposed to be soon leaving the country. Councillor MacNaughton will try to get in touch with him.

Councillor Mac Naughton moved for adjournment.
