

Thursday, February 19, 1951

Monthly meeting of the Stanley Village Council was held in the Council Chamber with Mayor John Mac Gilleway presiding.

The meeting opened with a prayer for Civic Authorities. Minutes were read and approved on a motion from Councillor Sanson seconded by Councillor Mac Naughton.

Mayor Mac Gilleway brought Council up to date on the work being done by workers of the Community Development Project # 1222 HE 4. Later in the meeting Bill Smith also made his report to Council. A committee for Village beautification has been set up consisting of Sandra & Walter Dorcas, Harry McAloon, Ora Ross, Agnes Sillier, David Steele and Betty Mac Gilleway.

The furnace taken out of the Womens Institute Hall is better than the one in the firehall according to Dexter Chappie. It was moved by Councillor Sanson and seconded by Councillor Mac Naughton that the furnace from the W. I. Hall be moved to replace the furnace in the Fire Hall & that a nominal fee of \$50 be set aside for Village beautification.

David Linnick bought the old wainscoting from the W. I. Hall for \$100. It was moved by Councillor Sanson that assets accrued from the Institute Hall be disposed of by the project manager Bill Smith at the best price that can be obtained. The money is to be turned over to the Village and set aside for Village beautification. Seconded by Councillor Mac Naughton. Carried.

Mayor Mac Gilleway reported that Jack

(a little stronger than the first) and finally a Final Notice advising this was to be handed to a lawyer for collection if not paid before a certain date. Council agreed that this sounded like a good idea and clerk was asked to write to Mrs. O'Keefe in Mac Adam for letter samples.

It was moved by Councillor Sansom & seconded by Councillor Mac Naughton that the Financial Statement for 1980 as audited by J.W. Keely B.A. be accepted. Carried.

A letter was read from Marion Mac Kinnon, secretary of the Recreation Council. The letter requested that Stanley Village Council set up a meeting with Mr. Kennedy & Mr. Duxal from the Department of Youth and Recreation and the Executive of the Upper Nashuaak Recreation Council to discuss a leadership Assistance Program for the Stanley area. The request was given careful consideration. Council decided the clerk should write to Mrs. Mac Kinnon stating that Councillor Brittany is Village Council official representative to the Upper Nashuaak Recreation Council. If the " " " " wished to set up a meeting, Councillor Brittany will represent the Village Council officially & the Mayor and other Council will <sup>try to</sup> attend.

Mayor Mac Gillivray will be absent for March 12 regular meeting, Council decided to have a meeting with the Deputy Mayor.

Councillor Mac Naughton moved adjournment
