The meeting opened with a prayer for Kiwi Authorities.

The minutes were read and approved on a motion from Councillor Macneighton seconded by Councillor Sansom.

Council decided that the third sewage payment request letter should be sent on June 1, and the fourth when the next billing goes out July 1, 1981.

Twenty trees have been planted up by Nasirah Villa and ^{the} Jessel Centre and on the south side of the river. Council expressed approval of the work done by the people on the Village Beautification project.

Councillor Hanson moved that "The Village Council assume the responsibility for the debt incurred for life saving equipment bought by the women to be paid when the money is available. Motion seconded by Councillor Brittony. Carried.

Hanson turned the water on in the park and the pool is full of water. Council agreed that some action should be taken on the situation and Councillor Brittony agreed to talk to Bill Smith to see if it could be looked after through the Village Beautification Project.

A letter was read from the High School Principals asking Council to donate money for Graduation prizes. It was moved by Councillor Sansom and seconded by Councillor Brittony that Council would donate twenty-five dollars.

A letter was read from the Department

of Transportation designating that future correspondence with that Department be directed to Mrs. M. V. Mac Fadyen - Director of Engineering Administration with a carbon copy to be sent to the district engineers.

Councillor Mac Naughton had a letter that was sent to Council from the Reverend Mr. Farley requesting that the Council support Scouting in the fall of 1951. Councillor Britton volunteered to get more information on the subject.

Tentatively, next Council Meeting will be Thursday, June 4 because Councillor Sanson and the clerk will be away for most of June.

Capital Region Development Commission will have their annual meeting sometime in June and all members of the Council will be invited. Mr. Abernethy from Alberta will be there to discuss gas pipe lines and other matters.

At their request Upper Mowbray Recreation Council had members invited to Council. No one appeared. Councillor Sanson and Mayor Mac Gillivray had prepared a financial statement for them and Council studied it.

Councillor Sanson moved for adjournment.
