The meeting opened with a prayer for civic authorities.

The minutes were read and adopted on a motion by Councillor Mac Naughton seconded by Councillor Sansom.

Road work on the hill was discussed. There have been surveyors working but to date nothing has been done.

The library has been jacked up and the sewage has been connected. From the Grant of \$9500 there is \$2750 left. Council agreed to use this money for further library repairs.

Stanley Mutual Insurance Co. has offered office space to the Village Council and the use of the board room for Council Meetings. Since more space is needed for the library, Council felt they would like to look the situation over and that Stanley Mutual should be told that Council is interested.

Council agreed that Councillor Sansom should make arrangements with the P.C.M.A. for Halloween night.

Clerk reported that a permit had been issued to Chibi's Restaurant.

Clerk reported that no tenders have yet been received for the dump.

A Task Force for the Capital Regional Development Comm. was discussed. It was moved by Councillor Sansom and seconded by Councillor Brittany that Bill Smith be approached through his Beautification Committee and that they become an independent task force for the Capital Regional Development Commission.

Canadian Community Development Project proposals for 1982 have been prepared by the Stanley Beautification Committee. Councillor Sansom moved that the Village sponsor this project. Councillor Brittany seconded the motion & the papers were signed.

By-law #19 was given second and third reading and adopted on a motion from Councillor Mac Naughton seconded by Councillor Brittany.

Council had a discussion about how things stand with the Department of Environment and the 20101 the

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Department says is owed to them by the Village of Stanley. The agreement between the Department of Environment and the Village of Stanley was read, as well as some letters relating to the subject. Certainly the Department of Environment has been made fully aware of the Village of Stanley's stand on the matter. Council feels that in no way is that money owed to Department of the Environment.

Although Councillor Sansom and Mr. Robins have examined the work Hudford Construction has still to do on sewage and, altho Mr. Robins contacted Hudford Construction no work has been done.

Delinquent Sewage Bills were discussed. Mayor Mac Gillivray and Councillor Sansom plan a trip to town this month and will see what can be done.

Delinquent hook-ups were discussed. Council decided that the Department of Health should be contacted about them.

Councillor Buttery wondered if anything could be done about the lock. Council's general opinion is that it's a rather hopeless situation. Councillor Buttery was asked to get in touch with the Agricultural Society to see if they would be interested in taking back the land.

Councillor Mac Naughton moved for adjournment.
