

Thursday, September 10, 1981

Regular monthly meeting of the Stanley Village Council was held in the Council Chamber with Mayor John Mac Gillivray presiding.

The meeting opened with a prayer for Civic Authorities.

The minutes were read and approved on a motion from Councillor Mac Naughton seconded by Councillor Sansom.

Mayor Mac Gillivray received a call to day from Mr. Mac Fagan of the Department of Highways. The Mayor was told that tenders will go out this week for work on the Stanley hill and that storm drainage and curbing will be the main priority.

The Stimulation Grant was discussed. The following proposal was submitted by Hod Bros. Ltd.

We propose to replace (2) two walls in foundation - back wall and left side wall including all excavation and back fill, waterproofing wall all back-up to new sewage exterior and interior plumbing.

All material and labor included for contract price all taxes included of \$7,200.00 (seven thousand two hundred dollars)

Councillor Sansom moved that this contract be adopted. Councillor Brittany seconded the motion. Carried.

Councillor Mac Naughton had been talking to Mr. Mason about cleaning up the premises of the truck building. He was told that Mr. Mason would be ~~away~~ away for the winter and Council would have to bear with him as he hoped to sell the

Councillor Sansom reported that Chut had called him about a permit for his games room. Chut was told to send the by-law regulations with the permit when it is issued.

Requests for tenders for a trench at the dump should soon be submitted. Chut was asked to write to D. J. Enterprises, Glenwood Drive, and Pat Flynn. It was moved by Councillor Sansom & seconded by Councillor Mac Naughton that Byron Mac Donald should be asked to stake out the new trench and that the men should see the stake-out before presenting tenders. Carried.

It was moved by Councillor Sansom and seconded by Councillor Mac Naughton that "Insurance on the Fire Hall should be increased from \$3000⁰⁰ (three thousand), to \$15000⁰⁰ (fifteen thousand) for three years payable on a yearly basis at a rate of approximately \$75⁰⁰ / annum" Carried.

Jack Hamer on behalf of the Capital Regional Development Commission talked to Council about the various expectations and commitments of the Commission. Council hopes to have a Village task force by late October.

Hendall Case sent an estimate for fire hall equipment. A foam hose nozzle would cost \$650⁰⁰ and foam is \$7/can. Councillor Mac Naughton suggested that foam might be circulated with other fire departments and Mayor Mac Gilleway said that he would look into it.

Byron Spellman resigned as Development Officer as of June 10, 1981. Council discussed a replacement and Councillor Mac Naughton agreed to take responsibility of finding a suitable

candidate. Councillor Sansom moved and Councillor
Brittany seconded the motion that "Councillor
Mac Naughton be made Temporary Development Officer.

By-law #19 was given first reading. It is
a building By-law.

Councillor Brittany moved for adjournment
