

Thursday, December 9, 1982

The regular monthly meeting of the Stanley Village Council was held in the Council Chambers with Mayor John M. Sweeney presiding.

The meeting opened with a Prayer for Civic Authorities.

The minutes were read and approved on a motion from Councillor Sanson seconded by Councillor Buttery.

Council furnished information regarding the homes of Leese Guen and Edison Farmer and land owned by David Dorcas. D. Lela Forbes has requested this information to take judgment on these properties.

The Village had received an extra grant of \$971.00 for the 1983 Budget. The Budget was reviewed. Councillor Sanson moved that the extra \$971.00 should be put in under Historic Sites in Preservation and Culture with thoughts of doing work on the Cenotaph. Councillor Buttery seconded the motion. Carried.

A Bi-Centennial Committee for the Village was discussed. Clerk volunteered to try to have a nucleus by the first of the year. Several names were discussed.

Financial projection for Dec. 31, 1982 is \$4365 Surplus. Councillor Sanson moved that \$3500 be spent on an electric pump for the firehall, repairs to the firehall and a new table for Council. Councillor Buttery seconded the motion. Carried.

A letter was read from the Department of Transportation asking for five year priorities for roadwork from Council. The Council wanted listed the Red Rock Road, The English Settlement Road and the Red Rock Road. Next year would be cleaning ditches and hauling fill for the Red Rock Road.

Application for a Stimulation Grant for 1989 was discussed. Councillor Sansom offered to look after it.

An easement from the Dept. of Public Works for sewage for the Post Office was read. It was moved by Councillor Sansom and seconded by Councillor Mac Naughton that Village pay the \$400 and accept the easement. Carried.

It was moved by Councillor Buttery and seconded by Councillor Sansom that Council accept the budget presented by the Capital Regional Development Commission Motion carried.

It was moved by Councillor Sansom seconded by Councillor Mac Naughton that the street leading to David Lemrick's house be called Snow Lane.

Council has been told that there is a grant available to save fuel for libraries. Councillor Sansom offered to get in touch with Sam MacDonell to see what can be done.

Since Council intends to get a new table and since former Councillor Rev. Vancouver donated the present table Clerk was asked to get in touch with Maude Vancouver to see what she wanted done with it.

Councillor Mac Naughton moved for adjournment.
