

The minutes were read and approved on a motion by Councillor Mac Naughton seconded by Councillor Bentley.

Councillor Sansom reported that he had surveyed the Village parking problems with a member of the Department of Transportation. The Department of Transportation will soon send Council a written report on this matter.

Councillor Mac Naughton had spoken to Doug Mac Donnell about snow removal behind the York Wood Producer's building. Councillor Mac Naughton, because of further parking problems not clearing the area would cause, told him to keep it clear until he spoke to Council. Council decided to continue having it cleared.

Councillor Mac Naughton had received the plan for the addition to the rink and an application for a building permit from the Upper Nashua Recreation Council. Councillors looked over the plan and decided that a building permit should be issued. Council also decided to re-negotiate next fall regarding oil payments for the two furnaces the rink will be operating.

Firechief Melvin Bartlett and Walter Dorcas were present when Councillor Sansom presented a plan for the re-organization of the Stanley Fire Department on which all three of them had been working.

The following points were the major ones in the report. (1) The Fire Department as an area concept rather than a Village concept. (2) Permanent firemen's spot to be suspended by April. (3) Fire phone at Alvin Bartlett's house to be moved to his garage. (4) Daytime fire responsibility rest at the garage - compensation for which is to be worked out by Councillor Sansom and Mr. Bartlett. Fire Hall checks, truck maintenance and a volunteer daytime fireman will be provided by Mr. Bartlett. (5) The firechief will arrange proper courses for the extra fire volunteers. (6) Phillip Complex will look after sewage maintenance.

Thursday February 11, 1982.

It was moved by Councillor Britting and seconded by Councillor Mac Naughton that the recommendations as presented by the committee be accepted by the Council. Carried.

Mayor Mac Gillivray thanked the Committee.

A letter from Village lawyer Peter Forbes was read to Council regarding unpaid sewage bills and their collection. Councillor Sanson made the following motion: Be it resolved that Mr. D. Peter Forbes, barrister and solicitor be authorized to act on behalf of the Village of Stanley, New Brunswick in connection with all legal matters that may be in the interest of the Village and the Village of Stanley confirms and ratifies all actions heretofore taken by Mr. Forbes in relation to collection of sewer accounts in the Village and any land purchased currently being contemplated by the Village. Councillor Britting seconded the motion. Carried.

The Village Beautification Committee has received a grant from the office of the Canadian Community Development Project, Project 1229 PE 6. Mayor Mac Gillivray brought it to the attention of Council for approval.

Councillor Sanson moved that it be accepted, and that Bill Smith represent the Village interests and that Mayor Mac Gillivray and Councillor Britting sign for the Village. Councillor Mac Naughton seconded this motion. Carried.

Then followed a discussion of snow build up in various parts of the Village. Council feels that it is a Department of Transportation responsibility & Councillor Sanson volunteered to talk to its members from this Department when he goes to Fredericton next.
