The regular monthly meeting of the Stanley Village Council was held in the Council Chamber with Mayor John Mac Gillivray presiding.

The meeting opened with a prayer for Council Authorities.

The minutes were read, corrected and approved.

It was reported that Bill and Steve Gillison had done ten excellent jobs at the dump. They had the lowest bid.

The work on the highway has yet to be started but has been promised and should start soon. ~~John~~ Mayor Mac Gillivray had been talking to Paul McFadden and was told that the Department of Transportation had \$500,000 set aside for Stanley Road work. If any is left it would be used to improve the Red Rock Road.

Council granted club permission to write a letter of complaint to the New Brunswick River Commission about the slow action given to the Village in repairing, replacing and relocating street lights.

Council has received a letter saying that Laurie Savage will appear before the appeal board for authority to be granted a building permit on July 27, 1982 at 10 a.m.
