

Thursday, October 14, 1982

Regular Meeting of the Stanley Village Council was held in the Council Chamber with Mayor John Mac Gillewary presiding.

Meeting opened with a Prayer for Civic Authorities.

Minutes were read and approved on a motion from Councillor Mac Naughton seconded by Councillor Sansom.

Nothing has yet been heard about the House Waste case. Councillor Sansom had been talking to Mr. Stevenson and was told that the committee had a backlog of cases and it could take some time.

The strip in front of Colmer Sparkes has been filed with the Stimulation Grant paying for the pavement. Mac Linnon's store front was not done when the hill was paved. Council decided that if more funds are available that this job should be done.

Councillor Sansom, Carl Hervey & a man from the Department of Transportation counted all houses serviced by the Stanley Dump. As a result the h. s. d. grant to the Village should be increased by 300 more homes in the 1983 budget.

* Mayor Mac Gillewary asked Council if they wanted to review Byron Mac Donald's dump contract. Council will determine the cost of running the dump & have new figure for the 1983 budget.

Mayor Mac Gillewary stated that Capital Regional Development Incorporated has been

the Stanley Village Council saying that approval is given for work at the rink. They need approval from the Village Council to apply for a government grant. They also requested permission to use septic tanks left by Herford Construction for sewage hook up. Council decided to ask members from the Recreation Council to come to a special meeting on October 21 with proposals, plans, cost, etc.

It was moved by Councillor Sanson that pay increases to Mayor, Councillors and employees for 1983 budget follow the Federal Guidelines of 6% and 5%. The rest of the budget should follow provincial guidelines of 9.2%. Motion seconded by Councillor Brittany. Carried.

Questionnaires from the Association of Villages were answered by Council.

Council decided to follow previous guidelines for Hollow's amount 1982.

Sewage accounts were discussed and Council decided a warning letter should be sent to all who owe over \$120⁰⁰.

It was moved by Councillor Sanson and seconded by Councillor Brittany that \$120⁰⁰ outstanding sewage bills should be the guideline for letters of notice 1, 2 & 3. That is if someone has all ready had letter #1, paid that bill and is now again over \$120⁰⁰ he should receive letter #2. Motion carried.

Clerk was asked to send tenders for snow removal to De J Enterprises, Pat Flynn, Marty Linnock, Gary Gordine, Denis Foreman and Murray Foreman. Tenders

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Should be back to Council by November 10.

Councillor Britton will lay the Village wreath on the Cenotaph on November 11.

Clerk was asked to write a letter to Imperial Oil and complain about the mess at the Esso pumps.

Councillor Britton moved adjournment
