

Monday, September 13, 1954

Monday Village Council met in the Stanley Mutual Insurance building with Mayor John Mac Gillivray presiding.

The meeting opened with a hymn for Live Outcasts.

Minutes were read and approved on a motion from Councillor Mac Naughton, seconded by Councillor Buttney.

Mayor Mac Gillivray and Councillor Sansom have been in touch with authorities in Fredericton about giving up responsibility for the dump. Councillor Sansom is to do a survey with a man from that Department.

The paving of routes 107 and 103 is well underway.

Councillors Mac Naughton and Sansom attended the hearing about the Leura sewage property where Councillor Mac Naughton spoke for the Village. No verdict has been yet given.

A letter was read from the Village lawyer D. Lee Forbes regarding the sink property. He suggested that Council let things stand as they are for the time being. It was moved by ~~Council~~^{Councilor} Councillor Mac Naughton and seconded by Councillor Buttney to follow the lawyer's advice.

Land for the Village was thought to have been finalized but all the Village has so far is an easement over the school property. It was moved by Councillor Buttney and seconded by Councillor Mac Naughton that Council try to get the claim on the ^{all} ~~the~~ Nashua Loop and Paper property behind the Insurance

A letter was read from Sir Sullivan thanking Council
for their donation of a graduation prize show in history.

* Councillor Sansom moved that Prince Campbell
be directed to go on course for Sewage Maintenance
Finance to be paid for by the Village. Councillor
Brittany seconded the motion. Carried.
