

Thursday, August 18, 1983

The regular meeting of the Stanley Village Council was held in the Council Chambers with Mayor J. William Smith in the chair.

The Meeting opened with a prayer for Civic Authorities.

The minutes were read and approved on a motion from Councillor Mac Naughton seconded by Councillor Hood.

The Mayor's report consisted of the following:

- ① Since the last meeting Mayor Smith has been talking to one of the citizens with a lien on his property. Mayor Smith said it was out of Village hands and into the hands of the lawyer at this stage.
- ② On July 19 The Mayor, the clerk & Councillor Hood attended a budget meeting^{'84} with Mrs Butler in Harry Arnold's office. No raise in unconditional grant or warrant will be approved by the Department of Municipal Affairs. If we raise spending any more than approximately 3% the tax rate will raise.
- ③ On the matter of the Cenotaph repair job. Williamsburg W.I. have requested having a job done on theirs at the same time that the work is done in Stanley. They have pledged \$150 to the Cenotaph fund and the job should not be much over that. Napadogan Legion has also contributed to the fund.
- ④ There was a request for a copy of the By-laws but since there is no actual copy the by-laws may be read at the Clerk's convenience.
- ⑤ An outstanding June April cheque was paid to

to the Capital Regional Development Commission with broader coverage concerning feasibility studies hiring consultants etc. with emphasis on developing tourism. The Mayor passed the information on thinking it might be helpful financially to the Museum Committee. (8) An Estimator firm has been asked to look at the dump (9) Three covered manholes have been found & will be attended to in the near future.

Mayor Smith also reported that he had been talking to Mr. Campbell who was interested in buying Mr. Mason's lot on Stanley Hill on which to put a trailer. According to the Community Plan for the village of Stanley it would be against zoning regulations. Permission could probably be obtained from the Department of Municipal Affairs. Council discussed the situation. Mayor Smith said he would get back to Mr. Campbell with this information & tell him that subject to application it could be amended.

Mayor Smith told Council that 2 Department of Transportation signs had to be erected for Eleanor Sparkes' parking problem and it will cost \$200. There is no way the Village can erect its own signs and have it legal.

Mayor Smith reported on Job Creation Strategy. He said that two days had been spent by the workers in the Lion's Club Ball Park at Cross Creek for two days.

Treasurer's report was passed around.

Mayor Smith read a letter from the Dept. of Municipal Affairs announcing a Stimulation Grant of \$6000. There followed a discussion of possible repairs to the Red Rock Road. Councillor Mac Naughton mentioned that the

Red Rock Road was a designated highway and was therefore the responsibility of the Department of Transportation.

It was moved by Councillor Wood and seconded by Councillor Ross that Councillor Mac Naughton should get in touch with Eadie Hawry for price of ① a culvert for Edie Baker ② a culvert for Arthur Prie ③ A culvert across the road from Kenwood Anderson ④ a culvert to be torn out at Blair's lower lot & skirt the ditch and ⑤ put a few loads of gravel in the ditch in front of Bill Smith's house. Motion carried. Council decided that if prices were away out of line they would have a telephone discussion.

Council discussed the parking & messes at the Cenotaph. Wayne Smith said he'd talk to Sp. Gauthier of the R.C.M.S. about it.

A letter was read from Robert Howie, M.P.

A letter was read from the St. John Ambulance Soc.

A letter was read from the Lunenburg Council for the Disabled.

A letter was read from Mr. Poirier, Minister of Municipal Affairs requesting Council to appoint a member for the Regional Assessment Review Board. Council discussed the situation and decided that it was not a feasible request for a village this small.

A letter was read from the library with a request to sell a table. This request was granted on a motion from Councillor Wood.
