

Thursday, December 9, 1983

The regular meeting of the Stanley Village Council took place in the Council Chamber with Mayor J. William Smith in the chair.

The meeting opened with a prayer for Civil Authorities.

Mayor's report consisted of the following:

There will be a third meeting about building an arena on December 11 in which, ^{Mayor} Benson ^{from ~~Clinton~~ ~~Dunktown~~ PA} Carby will explain the positive effects for an arena in the community. At the last meeting Mayor Smith put forth Council's stand off opinion of the idea of an arena built in Stanley. The question was asked if the Council had to be involved other than to issue a building permit. It was confirmed that sewage rates would be \$330/month for an arena.

The Mayor has had enquiries about keeping the bridge clear of snow this winter. Council decided that if the Department of Transportation would not do it Council would have it done locally and deduct it from D.O.P.'s monthly bill.

Mayor Smith had attended a meeting in Judewickon concerning Social Reform and delivered literature on this subject to Councillors.

The minutes were read, corrected and adopted on a motion from Councillor MacNaughton seconded by Councillor Ross.

Councillor Ross had given Al Down the clerk's phone number and Councillor Woods phone number but he hasn't been heard from. Councillor Ross will contact him again.

Councillor MacNaughton reported that

It was moved by Councillor Wood and seconded by Councillor Ross that a street light be put up by Wells on the hemlock Rd. Carried.

Councillor Ross reported that all items OK'd at the last meeting for the firehall have been purchased. The waterpump on the firetruck is broken. Melvin gave the following estimate for water for the firehall \$1500 for labor, \$1000 for pipe, 1000 for a reservoir and sand for pipe \$400

Councillor Ross made the motion that the masonry repair of the blocks in the library be done and the blocks be waterproofed. Councillor Wood seconded the motion. Carried. Edy Cisar thought he had the leak in the library fixed but it leaked after so Doug Wood had a look at it and will explain to Edy what to do. Metal flashing should do the trick.

Councillor Ross moved that Council purchase as much material as possible for supplying water to the firehall. Councillor MacNaughton seconded the motion. Carried.

Wayn Smith had been talking Galle at the Government Garage to find out about buying culverts. He called Streason in St. John and got the following prices per foot 18" pipe is \$7.41 and 24" pipe is \$11.94 plus tax. These would have to be picked up but otherwise are the same prices charged at the Government Garage. Estimated cost of 2 cross culverts and 6 culverts is \$2500 Councillor Ross made the following motion that Council purchase 10 sections of 24" x 8' of concrete pipe 18 pieces of 18" x 8' sections and 6 pieces of 9" x 24' steel culvert, 6 pieces of 12" x 24 feet steel culvert required for projected road maintenance. The mayor will look after Transportation Councillor Wood seconded the motion Carried.

Thursday, December 8, 1983

Walter Doucas has complained that tree limbs at Helen Linrocki and Jerry Hendersons have been interfering with the Grader. Councillor MacNaughton moved that Hendersons & Linrocki be contacted to see if the limbs could be removed. Councillor Hood seconded the motion. Carried. Councillor Hood will contact them and Mayor Smith will see that they are cut.

Council Hood made the motion that 14 loads of topsoil be purchased for use in the spring. Councillor Ross seconded the motion. Carried.

Mayor Smith read a letter stating that the grant for the Upper Nashuaak Bicentennial Committee will be given through the Village.

Application for 1984 Stimulation Grant was discussed and tabled.

Capital Regional Development Commission Incorporated Budget was received and accepted as presented on a motion from Councillor Ross seconded by Councillor Hood.

A letter was read from the Minister of Commerce and Development regarding new Main Street program project.

A letter from the Deputy Minister of Transportation regarding lists of road work preferences was read.

A letter was read from the Canadian Institute of the Blind requesting help for a Dorothy Doucas trust fund.

A letter of Christmas wishes was read from the Association of Villagers.

Slippery roads and heels were discussed that is a Department of Transportation responsibility.

Councillor Ross moved adjournment
