Before the meeting was officially opened, Jim MacQuade presented a Village Work and Management Program to Council. He will work with Councillor Hanson to see if his services could be agreed.

The regular meeting opened with a prayer for Civic Authorities.

The minutes were read and approved on a motion by Councillor Hanson, seconded by Councillor Britton.

A letter was read from the Stanley Women's Institute stating that \$100 would be available to re-polish & re-letter the cenotaph. Councillor suggested that Nelson's Monument Company be asked to do a cost estimate on this matter.

A letter was read from the Bi-Centennial Committee announcing a meeting on Monday February 21, 1983. Councillor MacNaughton said that he would try to attend.

Councillor Britton registered a complaint from Bob Harvey about the snow on the Stanley Bridge. Carl Harvey claimed it was the responsibility of the Bridge Committee & he had none. It is not the responsibility of the Village but of the Department of Transportation. Councillor Britton said that he would contact Carl to see what can be done.

Councillor Hanson had been talking to Bill Smith about Boy Scouts Community work for their badges for Cidres. Bill thought it would be OK to have them look after the new trees - fertilizing, spraying, etc. Council approved.
