

Thursday, June 9, 1983

The regular meeting of the Stanley Village Council took place in the Council Chambers with Mayor J. William Smith in the chair.

The meeting opened with a prayer for Civic Authorities.

The Mayor's report consisted of the following topics:

1. Street sweeping Councillor Hood had arranged.
- x 2. Philip Campbell was contracted for grass mowing @ \$7/hour.
3. The Association of Villages 12 Annual meeting at Sussex Corner and how profitable he said Councillor Ross had found it.
4. The Chairman of the Transportation Committee of the Association of Villages presented a revamped agreement for designated highways and the Department of Transportation. He asked for the co-operation of all Village Councils to go over the proposed agreement and to make their findings known to him before further action is taken.
5. Village of Stanley needs a new Development Offices.
6. Stanley is allowed only one representation on the Capital Regional Development Commission.

The minutes were read and adopted on a motion from Councillor Ross seconded by Councillor Hood.

x Councillor Hood reported that Philip Campbell was too busy to sweep the streets so Eddie Butler & his son did it for \$60⁰⁰ plus \$30⁰⁰ for a new broom. Harrison Avenue's sand & mess was discussed and it was decided to get the front truck for that job.

Councillor Ross reported that all the trees had been sprayed by Mark Hogan and Mayor Smith.

John Mac Gillivray came to the only Stanley representative to the Capital Regional Development Commission.

Mayor Smith had been talking to John who is willing to stay on representing the Village & who will give Council

their request is.

Letters were read from Mrs. Hebert Regional Librarian and Peg Davis, Chairman of Stanley Public Library Board requesting a telephone for the library. That would be \$41.50 for installation and \$8.50 month for use.

Councillor Wood moved that since it will be an asset to the library a telephone should be installed for the use of the library staff only. Motion seconded by Councillor Ross. Carried.

Letter from the Department of Environment was read regarding Organic load in the lagoon. It is an acceptable load.

Letter from the Department of Tourism was read asking Council to add to a list they are compiling of any relevant information for a tourist who might travel through New Brunswick. Council wished to have mentioned the Stanley Fair, the Farmer's Market, the scenic drive up the Nashuaack and the Upper Nashuaack Lions Club July 1 parade and chicken bar-b-q.

A letter was read from Sandra Allen requesting information about special tax benefits for land registered under the Farm Land Identification.

A job creation program for Youth was discussed. This program is set up in connection with the Bicentennial Committee. ~~It~~ ^{four} ~~thousands~~ ^{are} ~~are~~ ^{to} ~~be~~ ^{be} ~~heard~~ ^{heard} it will cost the Village approximately \$~~2000~~ ²⁸⁰. It was moved by Councillor Wood and seconded by Councillor Ross that Mayor Smith look after the applications for job creation strategy. Carried.

Murray Thomas requested through Councillor Wood that bulldozers be put down on Village property near the river.

Agnes Spilman wants the dead elms by the Catholic Church cut down. This is not a Village responsibility and there are no projects in sight to pay for them.

Councillor Mac Naughton and Councillor Ross

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will examine properties of Arthur Reed and Harold Anderson and Pauline Douce regarding culverts and gravel and report back to Council. Pauline Douce called for a load of fill for her culvert. Arthur Reed wants an 8" culvert & a load of gravel and Harold Anderson wants an 8" culvert.

Councillor Reed reported on the needs of the Fire Department among which are a two way radio, extra air tanks for the breathing apparatus, snake skin hose to pump water from the river up the hill, extra cans of foam for electric fire. He had visited the fire hall and talked to some of the men and was reporting back to Council. Firemen would also like fire hoses for the outlying districts but this is not the responsibility of the Village. Hose is on sale at Safely Supply until the end of June. Councillor Ross told them to order ^{four or 5} ~~two~~. He also inquired about Levey radios at the Association of Villages annual meeting and learned that N.B. Tel rents them at \$45 / phone. Lt Flynn has two radios and three antennas and paid \$73⁰⁰.

Council also discussed a sewage snake at a cost estimate of 2000 for one on power. Clerk was asked how much had been spent since sewage was first put in on special cleaning for pipes. He brought to next meeting.

Council was asked to consider who would be the next Development Officer.

Councillor Hood adjourned.
