

Thursday, March 10, 1953

The regular monthly meeting of the Stanley Village Council was held in the Council Chambers with Mayor John Mac Gillivray presiding.

The meeting opened with a Prayer for Civic Outcomes.

The minutes were read and approved on a motion from Councillor Sanson seconded by Councillor Britton.

Councillor Sanson had been talking to a representative from Nelson's Monuments. He estimated the job will take \$1000 - \$1200. It could be taken to Gussess or done in Stanley. Council prefers the latter. Clerk was asked to write to Members of Napedogan Region, ~~the~~ Nashua Budget Region and Institutes in Ward Settlement and Williamsburg. The Sewer have donated \$10.56 and the Scout Committee \$20.

Councillor Mac Naughton made the following motion seconded by Councillor Sanson.

Mayor John Mac Gillivray and Clerk Shirley Sanson were duly authorized by Council to sign the easement for sewage across the Stanley Post Office property.

Cyrus Mac Donald has informed Mayor Mac Gillivray that he can no longer look after the dump. It was moved by Councillor Britton and seconded by Councillor Mac Naughton that this situation should be reviewed in the fall, but in the meantime
