

Mac Naughton and Councillor Oia Ross.

Then the meeting was opened with Mayor Smith presiding. The meeting opened with a prayer for Civic Authorities.

The minutes were read and approved on a motion by Councillor Mac Naughton seconded by Councillor Hood.

Dogs in the Village were discussed. Council concluded that altho the Village has a by-law about dogs it can't be enforced because of lack of funds to properly supply the Village with a dogcatcher.

Councillor Mac Naughton explained that having a key to the ~~city~~ and to the Post Office is standard procedure <sup>on</sup> throughout the Province and although it adds \$2.50 to the cost the first year, the \$2.50 is not charged in the future.

Mayor Smith mentioned that the Bicentennial Grant will not be repayable until Sept. 1983.

Councillor Mac Naughton explained Council's proposed work on the Cenotaph.

Mayor Smith explained the Stanley Scouts care of the trees in the Village. It is expected that the tent caterpillar will soon be on the march and that the trees planted in 1981 and 1982 should be sprayed. It was moved by Councillor Hood and seconded by Councillor Mac Naughton that Councillor Ross be in charge of trying to get 140 trees sprayed by someone knowledgeable about spraying. Carried.

A letter was read from The Association of Villages. The annual meeting will be held at Sussex Corner on June 3rd & 4th. Mayor Smith and Councillor Ross plan to attend.

A letter <sup>was read</sup> from the principal of Stanley High School asking for donations for prizes for graduation. It was moved by Councillor Ross, seconded by Councillor Dord that \$30<sup>00</sup> be given for this purpose.

Mayor Smuck mentioned the importance of the Capital Regional Development Commission of which John Mac Gillivray is president. Mayor Smuck read a letter he'd received from the Commission which they by-laws quoted that it is possible for Mr. Mac Gillivray to stay on as President and Council's representative. It was moved by Councillor Ross that Council defer a decision on a delegate to the Capital Regional Development Commission until Council is more familiar with the matter. Councillor Dord seconded the motion. Carried.

It was moved by Councillor Dord and seconded by Councillor Mac Naughton that Mayor Smuck and the clerk be cosigners of a request for the Village of Stanley.

The question of a phone for the library was raised and it was tabled till the next meeting when the clerk is to have an estimate of the cost.

It was moved by Councillor Ross and seconded by Councillor Dord that the Village should pay for dinner for Councillor and spouse at the Capital Regional Development Commission Annual Meeting.

Councillor Ross agreed to look after matters for the Fire Department. Councillor Dord agreed to attend some meetings of the Upper Nashwaak Recreation Council.

x that Sheep Campbell be asked to sweep in front of the bank and Clifford Mac Kinnone and other places requiring sweeping. Carried.

Gene & Kathleen Newen want a street light and this request was discussed. They will be told to approach Council with a letter.

It was moved by Councillor Ford and seconded by Councillor Ross that Council keep Tom Keely for an auditor and J. Lee Forbes for a lawyer. Carried.

Councillor Mac Naughton moved for adjournment.
