

Thursday, October 13, 1983

The regular monthly meeting of the Stanley Village Council was held in the Council Chamber with Mayor J. William Smith in the chair.

The meeting opened with a prayer for Civic Authorities.

The Mayor's Report contained the following:

- 1) On Tuesday Sept 20 Mayor Smith attended a zone meeting of the Association of Villages. Mayor Smith feels that attendance at such a meeting there is a route to air any grievances Council might have, discuss problems and to present to the Association any items of change or amendments to the legislation Council feels will improve our local situation.
- 2) Money is being spent to improve roads in English Settlement, Fredericksburg and Couraibury. Mayor Smith checked on the possibility of fixing the Red Rock Road and was told that this particular money was being spent outside municipalities. Suggestion was made that the District ^{District} Engineer be notified of Council's intentions for the Red Rock Road and the Mayor read a letter he had written regarding this subject. Mayor Smith reminded Council that "\$20000" must be spent before year end or be deducted from 1985 ~~Warrant~~. Unconditional Transfer.
3. The Mayor had had new complaints about rats and reminded Council they should decide if they want more poison, a new truck or both.
4. Mayor Smith said he would present Council

Work on both Cenotaphs has been completed.

Mayor Smith had had a call from the Dept. of Health wanting information about rat control. It was moved by Councillor Wood that the rats at the dump be given another application of poison and after the poison is applied a new trench should be dug by local invited tenders. Councillor Rose seconded the motion. Carried.

Councillor Mac Naughton reported that the work had been done on Eddie Butari's culvert, the driveway at Joseph Deyes, culvert taken out and cleaned ^{depth} at Eddie Cause. Councillor Mac Naughton will find out if Dept. of Insurp. can finish the work to be done this fall and if not hire someone else to do it. A letter was read from Frances Porter requesting a culvert for the United Church Manse. Council decided that a small ditch and a culvert were needed. Councillor Wood moved that this situation be remedied. Councillor Mac Naughton seconded the motion. Carried.

Councillor Wood reported on the Municipal Orientation Session held on Sept 16 and 17. Budget and Finance were discussed as well as Legislative Power and role and responsibility of Council. Councillor Wood found the meeting very interesting and said that she'd learned a lot.

Councillor Rose talked to Melvin Bartlett about a running inventory for the Fire Department and Melvin agreed to it.

Councillor Wood reported that the Villa's drainage problem had been repaired. She also said that the Villa wanted the firemen

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to have a fire fighting demonstration for the Employees. Councillor Wood also said that the Stanley Saint John Ambulance Brigade came first in first aid in the Provincial Championships and that the Villa plans to serve meals on wheels the first of the year if enough people are in need and there are enough volunteers.

Mayor Smith reported that Bicentennial Court and Field is completed. Remaining work was done by Danny Cleveland.

Halloween night. Melvin and the boys will be at the Fire Hall which Council will also make their headquarters. Mayor Smith will look after the other arrangements.

Mayor Smith said that Reg Davis had officially resigned from the library Board. Councillor Ross said he would consider it and Mayor Smith said he'd look for one other member. A letter was read from Iesta Henderson requesting minor repairs to the library. It was moved by Councillor MacNaughton, seconded by Councillor Ross that Council undertake those repairs. Carried.

A letter was read from D. Peter Jones regarding liens on Edison Palmer's and Leas Green's properties. It was moved by Councillor MacNaughton, seconded by Councillor Wood that "the lawyer be informed that Council wants a signed agreement with Leas Green and Edison Palmer stating that they pay \$26.67/mo. on sewage press.

Councillor Good seconded the motion. Carried.
Copies of "hunk" a newsletter from the
Capital Regional Development Commission were
given to Councillors.

Mayor Smith moved that his letter to the
Department of Transportation be adopted
as read.

Councillor Good moved for adjournment
seconded by Councillor Rose.
