

Thursday Sept 8, 1983

The regular monthly meeting of the Stanley Village Council took place in the Council Chamber with Mayor J. William Smith presiding.

The meeting opening with a prayer for Civic Authorities.

The minutes were read and approved on a motion from Councillor Ross seconded by Councillor Hood.

Mayor's Report contained the following:

- ① Job Creation Strategy ended Sept 2, 1982. Although no direct daily supervision was given to these students, work that was laid out could not be continued due largely to lack of self initiative and attitude. Positive results could be approximately 12 man days labor given to the Agricultural Society and 8-12 man days given to the Lion's Club. The Mayor recommended that Council go on record as endorsing these 4 students in the nearest possible category as "unemployable". Council has at present been reimbursed 90% of labor funding with the remainder to come on completion of job reports.
- ② On the subject of buried manholes. Doug Mac Donald has jackhammered out the 3 missing manholes and filled them with coarse aggregate at Mayor's recommendation as a cost saving measure. If this is not suitable in the future they will have to be built up to grade.
- ③ The Mayor said Stanley Fair was deemed a success and thanked Councillor Ross for

who is in charge of investigating the incident. Any
concrete information regarding this incident could be
passed on to the Mayor or directly to Constable
Bonhomone. It might be emphasized that in all
likelihood no conviction could be obtained but
life could be miserable for the offenders.

④ Mayor Smith recently attended a Boy Scout
meeting and reminded Council that it's
financial obligation to the Scouts is now due.

⑤ Angus reported to Mayor Smith that Mr. Moran
will come in mid-September to give the Cenotaph
its facelift. It has been suggested that Council
could put a dawn to dusk light at the cenotaph.

Councillor Ross reported on the collection bottles
he attended at the dump. He thought they were
very efficient in plugging rat holes with poison &
was assured by one of the men, whom he
knew that 2 or 3 bottles a year should be
sufficient.

Councillor Mac Naughton reported that Eddie
Harvey has yet to get in touch with him on
a cost estimate of culvert work. He recommended
that the work be done by the Department of
Transportation (local) because of cost and
supervision. Councillor Ross moved, seconded
by Councillor Mac Naughton that the culvert
jobs be handled by the Dept. of Transportation
motion carried. Mayor Smith said he would
get Pat Flynn to put a load of top soil between
the firehall and Gerald Hewitt when he
does work at the Cenotaph.

Councillor Ross said that the foundation
at the firehall has fallen down. Melvin said
that the firemen would look after it at no
cost unless there is a charge for material.

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Councillor Hood attended a Board of Directors meeting at Nashuak Villa. ~~Sept 6~~. Main topic of business was that there is a new doctor, highly recommended from Dalhousie University, coming to Stanley September 13. He will have 9-12 and 1-5 five days a week as well as Monday and Wednesday evenings and one week-end in 3. The Board of directors would like to see him well patronized. Dr. Wagener signed a contract for 28 hours a week but uses Stanley facilities only approx 18 or 19 hrs a week. Councillor Hood also mentioned the flooding problem at the Village and reported that Mr. ~~Compy~~ had been in touch with the Dept. of Supply and Services about it.

A letter was read from Chipman Council. Invitation to Fair. A letter soliciting funds was read from the Salvation Army. File till Budget.

Letter from Ray Frenette, temporary leader of N.B. Opposition Party was read.

Councillor Ross read a list of Fire Dept. needs but hadn't priced with it. Council had a discussion and decided to ask the Firemen to keep a running inventory. Clerk was asked to write to Emergency Measures to see if any assistance is available to the fire Department to buy equipment under the Dangerous Commodities Act. Councillor Ross moved & Councillor

Councillor Ross volunteered to investigate
this problem.

Councillor Ross moved for adjournment.
