There was a meeting of the Stanley Village Council in the Council Chambers with Mayor J. William Smith presiding. The meeting opened with a prayer for Civic Authorities.

The minutes were read, amended & adopted on a motion by Councillor Rose seconded by Councillor Hood.

Mayor's Report included the following:

There have been two requests for zoning by-law which were of a commercial nature. They were referred to "Village" Plan for Future land use in passing on commercially zoned land.

There is a request to release lands leased from Agricultural Society #33 west of the Senior Citizens Building. The deed was found and the land was released. The Village also has a deed to the park property.

A decision should be reached tonight regarding safety equipment for sewage works. Quotes for price of gas detector, harness & tripod will be given later.

The Lions Club would appreciate a donation

and could be more lenient than the Dept. of Municipal Affairs.

A flyer came out recently from the schools about a computer camp at Baithewick. I was concerned, knowing the sponsor of the camp and his prime reason for the promotion of it. On checking with the Deputy Minister of Youth and Education I was told that Stanley was not the only school to have the fly. Permission was given by the Superintendent of Schools & Youth & Recreation had no control.

Community Watch is alive and well. A meeting of the steering committee is scheduled for May 21 to bring an agenda to a general meeting in the near future.

A letter was read from the Dept. of Municipal Affairs stating that Harry Arnold has retired and Terry Youngblood is now the Municipal Service representative.

A letter was read from Emergency Measures requesting any plan for Emergency Measures in the Village. After some discussion Clerk was told to

wrote and say that the Village had no such plan, and would like a manual when it is written.

A letter was read from the Capital Regional Development Commission regarding tourism notices. Councillor Hood suggested that it be turned over to the Bicentennial Committee.

A letter was read from Susan Smith requesting that attention be given to the ditch between her house and Boonew.

Councillor Ross had a cheque made out to the Fire Dept. from Stanley Mutual Fire Insurance. Councillor Ross said Freeman had suggested that the money be spent toward a Chimney Sweeper to put gut fire and cool down chimneys. Total price \$260 but Stanley Mutual will pay another \$65 for it's purchase so it will cost the Village \$195.00. Councillor Ross made the motion, seconded by Councillor Hood that the Village purchase this piece of equipment. Carried.

Councillor Hood reported on Hospital Board meetings. After a series of meetings with the Board, Mr. Wacker a lawyer, Dr. Wagener, Dr. Murdock, Dr. Wagener is now under investigation by the College of Physicians and Surgeons, and the Credentials Committee which have photostats of his records. Dr. How is to arrive July 1, so the Village may be without a doctor in June unless they can get the one who is due in Boistown on July 1. Vella hopes to have a physio therapist and a dentist come to attend patients. Meade on wheels hope to have Sharon Flynn to co ordinate.

Mayor Smith said he'd talk to the K. C. M. S. about general noisiness at the cenotaph. Mrs. Bragash had complained about a fire then. Mayor Smith quoted prices of \$1040 for a tripod \$880 for a block & 400 for a wrench. 95.91 for a gas detector. Art Boone estimated \$500 or less to make a tripod. Councillor Wood made the motion that the other equipment be purchased from Safety Equipment and that Art Boone should make the tripod. Councillor Ross seconded the motion. Carried.

After some discussion about July 1 fireworks Councillor Mac Naughton made the motion that since it is Bicentennial year the Village should donate \$1000 toward this project. Councillor Ross seconded the motion. Carried.

There is more work to be done on the library. Clerk was asked to send out tenders describing the work to Byron Spielman, Tommy Dunphy and the Wood Bros. This idea was tabled till Council gets more information on the subject.

Meeting adjourned on a motion from Councillor Ross.
