* There was a meeting of the Stanley Village Council in the Council Chambers with Mayor J. William Smith presiding. Opened p. Civic Authorities Phillip Campbell discussed his duties regarding Sewage Maintenance with Council & reported that 2 heaters had been bought for the pumps so there would be a spare.

Mayor's report: Repairs to the library were completed by March 31. I met with Cecil Garland and the work that has been done was approved leaving us minus a paint job which is a must for this summer.

Thursday, May 10, 1984.

There was a meeting of the Stanley Village Council in the Council Chambers with Mayor J. Williams Smith presiding. The meeting opened with a prayer for Civic Authorities.

The minutes were read, amended & adopted on a motion by Councillor Rose seconded by Councillor Hood.

Mayor's Report included the following:

There have been two requests for zoning by-laws which were of a commercial nature. They were referred to Village Plan for Future land use in passing on commercially zoned land.

There was a request to release lands leased from Agricultural Society #33 west of the Senior Citizens Building. The deed was found and the land was released. The Village also has a deed to the park property.

A decision should be reached tonight regarding safety equipment for sewage works. Quotes for price of gas detector, harness & tripod will be given later.
