

Thursday, February 9, 1984.

The monthly meeting of the Stanley Village Council was held in the Council Chambers with Mayor J. William Smith presiding. The meeting opened with a prayer for Civic Authorities.

Mayor's report was read and consisted of the following: Permission was granted from the Minister of Municipal Affairs to spend the \$6000 Stimulation Grant on a new roof for the library. Doug Wood has been contracted to do the job as well as new windows & any other odds & ends as required.

The arena Directors last met on Monday February 6. Bob McGinn is chairman. The Building Committee reported that they had been to St. Stephen to see a building there & were impressed with the structure, felt it offered all that would be required locally. The Committee will ratify their constitution and by-laws soon & then will be incorporated.

Boy Scout Group is in a bit of difficulty with the Cub leader situation & the more people in the community who know about it the more likely one will show up. Bottle Day was a success 425^{rs} realized.

The Bi-Cent. Group has asked all organizations to submit a name or names of worthy citizens for consideration to be honored at a Citizens dinner to be held in March.

After several meetings with Eps. Ray Gauthier of the C. C. M. S. Angus acting as a concerned citizen and I as a village representative set up a public meeting for the purpose of organizing

On behalf of the Village I offered our clerk's services as secretary and indicated to her this would be considered an extra to be paid for by the Village at a rate of \$25⁰⁰ / meeting. Carried.

The minutes were read, corrected and adopted on a motion from Councillor Ross seconded by Councillor Hood.

Mayor Smith again mentioned the old hospital to Doug Mac Donald who said he'd look into the matter of making it safe for children.

Mayor Smith reported that the tree limbs have been cut so the grader can get by.

* Councillor Ross made the motion that Phillip be paid \$24⁰⁰ for extra labor and that he be informed that a schedule for maintenance would be forthcoming from the Council. Councillor Mac Naughton seconded the motion. Carried.

Mayor Smith said he had spoken to both the pharmacist and the banker regarding parking problems. He made them aware that if they needed it the Village owned the land by the Post Office.

Councillor Hood reported on a meeting of the Nashuaak Villa Board held February 8. So Dr. Murdock could attend. The meeting was about Dr. Wagener's attitude toward Dr. Murdock which has not been very good. There is

Mr. Somero reported to them that services of Fredericton and Stanley ambulances seem to overlap in some places and people are paying double taxes. A study is underway.

Next hospital Auxiliary meeting is February 18.

Councillor Ross reported that the library roof had leaked water over some books. He tries to watch the roof condition and that if the snow and ice build up again for her to call someone to shovel it off.

A letter was read from R. B. Armstrong - Dept of Tourism.

The Municipal Agreement with the Department of Transportation was read and signed.

Councillor Wood registered a complaint about the height of the snowbanks ~~at~~ on Harrison Ave. Mayor Smith will see that it's cleared.

Councillor Wood moved for adjournment.
