

The meeting opened with a prayer for Civic Authorities.

Mayor Smith reported that he had attended two meetings of a committee for an arena type complex. The first was attended by Mayor Benson Fisher of Doaktown who was very candid in how their arena had fared over the years.

The second meeting was held to officially elect a chairman and a secretary treasurer and 9 directors with a constitution to be brought in at a future meeting. Idea for all this is to incorporate.

Mayor Smith has agreed to sit as a director and suggested that it be stipulated that a representative from the Village be incorporated into their by-laws. The point is that the Committee is going ahead with this project whether the Village Council likes it or not. Mayor Smith assured Council he had in no way committed the Village and his main reason for sitting on the Board was to keep on top of things.

Mayor Smith reported that he'd heard some very favorable comment on the Upper Nashua Bicentennial Committee's enter-faith service held on January 1 and that Angus & the Committee had done a fine job.

The pipe was ordered and is in Stanley & when Doug has time he'll move it to the Village right of way down by the lagoon.

Edmestown N.B. a program on T.V. C.B.C. presented a fine portrait of Stanley on Wed. Jan 11, 1984. Clerk was asked to write a letter of thanks to the C.B.C.

Councillor Ross made the motion that the Village lawyer - Peter Forbes - be given permission to proceed with a Sheriff's sale for ~~600~~²⁴⁰ each on outstanding sewage bills with Edison Palmer and Leal Green. Councillor MacNaughton seconded the motion. Carried.

A letter was read from the Nashuaak Villa Board of Directors announcing that an auxiliary has been formed and asking for Council's support and interest.

Councillor Hood reported from the Nashuaak Villa Board of Directors that two paintings

Development Corporation asking Council for information about vacant lots & building in the Village. Council decided to list only the old hospital.

Councillor Wood reported that she had heard again complaints from Mrs. Somerville regarding the old hospital and she wondered if anything more could be done. Mayor Smith said he'd talk to Doug about it again.

A letter about an Energy conference was read from the energy secretariat.

Councillor Ross had been talking to Al Down the dogcatcher. Al said he would come up as soon as possible, take a look around and assess the situation. He'll send the bill to the Village.

Councillor Loss reported that early in December a lady from the Dept. of Health had a look at the dump & said it was in good condition.

Stimulation grant was discussed. A letter of explanation is to be written to the Minister of Municipal Affairs about the 1983 grant. An 1984 grant for paving will be requested.

Parking problems at the new pharmacy are anticipated and were discussed. The Village has property between the Post Office and the river that can be used if needed.

Councillor Ross ¹⁹⁸³ made the motion that the Council pay for material and labor for the stage that the Upper Nashua Bicentennial Committee had made. Councillor Mac Naughton seconded the motion Council.
