

The meeting was opened with a prayer for Euro Luthertian.
The minutes were read and adopted on a motion

The Mayor's report consisted of the following points:

The area had a fairly quiet Halloween night with
2 fires in Napadogen. Village hired Brian Mac Donald
and Mike Borgesch who patrolled for seven hours
and men were in the firehall till 2 a.m.

The Upper Nashuaak Bicentennial Committee is
still planning a few events and may need
help from the Village financially.

The Fire Dept. have asked for new equipment
which will be discussed when Councillor Ross'
report is read.

A recent Neighborhood Watch program steering
committee was poorly attended but another
meeting is planned for November 20.

People are working very hard on the Agnew
Complex. They have a Grant Application for \$350000
which they seem to have a good chance of
receiving. One third of the grant would be for
material so they have changed their concept of
the building to wood.

D. J. Enterprises received the tender for the dump
* and the trench has been completed.

Business arising from the minutes.

Mayor Smith reported that Metalfast had fixed
the firetruck where water had been sloshing down
and getting the motor wet. DePter feels that it is fixed.

The ~~cost~~ family cost of Cams for Ford Stanley was
discussed and Council decided to all be on the
look-out for a way to get it and permission to use it.

Councillor Hood reported that Danny Blewland has been evasive about working for the Village, as he has had other jobs. He told her that he and his buddies will clean up the Cenotaph for Remembrance Day. Councillor Hood will get in touch with him again, or see if she can get someone else.

Earl Thwey has built a garage, over his Sewer Easement and a search by lawyer D. Peter Forbes showed that his and four others have not been recorded in the York County records. Clerk has sent all written material on easements from the firm of Ashley, De Witt and Le Blanc to see if he can track them down. Peters bill for work on the cenotaph was \$209.50 and work on Sewage Bill collection was \$381 which is 25% of \$1550 which he had collected ^{Mac Naughton}

Councillor ~~Earl~~ made the motion that if the Upper Nashuaak Bicentennial Committee should fall short of funds before the year ends that the Stanley Village Council will reimburse them. Councillor Hood seconded the motion. Carried.

Boy Scouts have had a survey done on the property at Mirimachi Lake. Councillor Hood moved that the bill of \$335⁰⁰ should be paid from Village Funds. Councillor Mac Naughton seconded the motion. Carried.

Mayor Smith noted that the gull over the Skimmer Dam at the lagoon is rusted and needs to be sandblasted and painted next summer.

The mayor read Councillor Loss report which concerned the following points:

Communication etc. A discussion followed. Councillor Mac Naughton thought that such a complicated system was unnecessary & said they needed a couple of good walkie talkies.

Councillor Hood moved that Council purchase the van and take the radio till the December meeting. Councillor Mac Naughton seconded the motion. Carried.

Also in Councillor Hood's report was the fact that he had been in touch with Murray Foreman and Melvin Bartlett to do the work on the library wiring and chimney recommended in the Insurance Inspection report.

Councillor Hood made the motion, seconded by Councillor Mac Naughton that Council accept the assessment of \$277.00 for 1985 by the Capital Regional Development Committee. Carried.

Mayor Smith reported that David Bishop had told him that the Provincial Government had jobs of short duration for those who needed stamps to draw Unemployment Insurance.

Mayor Smith said that at a recent meeting of Stanley Mutual Insurance Directors there was nothing but praise for the Stanley Fire Department. They are in desperate need for volunteers which was discussed by Council.

Arthur Hurley ^{delivered} brought a sub division plan to Council from ~~George~~ ^{George} McCoy for lots on the Fish town Rd. Councillor Mac Naughton will take it to Jimmy Britteny. Council decided that Jimmy is to be reimbursed for any expenses he might incur for his work for the village on a motion from ~~Paul~~ ^{Paul}.

A letter from the Department of Environment regarding courses for operating sewage plants was read.

Mayor Smith will have a piece from the Village in the Upper Nashuaak Bicentennial final newsletter.

Councillor Wood reported on a recent meeting of the Hospital Board. They have a new monitor system which cost \$10,000. They had had a letter from the college of physicians and surgeons saying that it was up to the board to decide if Dr. Wagener is to be re-hired when his contract comes up soon. The doctors seem to be getting along fine. Maslin wheels is working well. Most volunteers are senior citizens. Arrangements have been made for senior citizens in this area who need it to use the whirlpool bath if need be. Dennis Foreman has been given the contract for snow removal. Mr. Somroy has asked again that the Fire Department do an equipment demonstration for the staff at the Villa. Apparently it was never done. Mayor Smith thought it had been done and will check.

A letter was read from the New Brunswick Sports Hall of Fame.

Councillor MacNaughton moved for adjournment.
