

Thursday, October 11, 1954

There was a meeting of the Stanley Village Council held in the Council Chamber with Mayor J. William Smith presiding.

The meeting opened with a prayer for Divine Assistance. The minutes were read and adopted on a motion by Councillor Ross seconded by Councillor Wood.

The Mayor's report read as follows:

Doug Mac Donald has fixed the trouble spot at John Mac Gillivray's sewer line and it was flushed out when it was corrected so hopefully the trouble spot is cured.

Metel Fab people were here from Kentville on last Tuesday to check the firetruck.

Melvin Gaultlett had approached the Mayor about the purchase of an equipment van which will be passed on to Council for discussion.

Business arising from the minutes:

The chip seal work requested cannot be done this year. The Dept. of Transportation will prepare for chip seal with 1 1/4" rocks and other material. Work orders have been sent for this.

No loan will be needed for the Upper Nash. Bicent Comm.

Councillor Ross got an Ct. from Council to hire Danny Cleveland to do odd jobs for the Village. She reported that the sign for Harrison Ave. had been fixed but no one seems to know how or who did it!

Clerk was asked to write to Stanley Thorburn to find out more about Lord Stanley's Coat of Arms for a pen.

Councillor Ross reported that a chimney cap for the library had yet to be made. Melvin never did get back to him about the radius but had requested an equipment van. After some discussion it was moved by Councillor Wood and seconded by Councillor

to Sept. 84 amounting to almost \$5000.00 was
examined. A thank-you note from the members
of the Stanley history Board was read.

A letter from the York Sunbury Historical Society,
soliciting money was read. Council thought that if
there were money to spare it should go to the Agri. Soc.

The Mayor explained to Council that the Boy Scout
Troop, which is sponsored by the Village, has applied for
a camp site at Mismachic Lake. The Committee named
the Village as applicant since Boy Scouts can't own property.

Councillor Wood couldn't get to the last meeting of the
Hospital Board but said things are about the same.

Council wondered if there is a map with lot
numbers and owners names on it. Clerk will
find out.

Councillor Dora asked if tenders were to be sent
out for snow removal and was told that the Village
used D. J. Enterprises for this. She then reminded
Council what terrible shape the sidewalks were in
last winter. Mayor Smith will discuss the situation with Doug.

Clerk was told to take the cheapest tender for the contract.

Councillor Wood said she'd heard several people
complaining about the condition of the old hospital.

Councillor Mac Naughton suggested Council take
the usual Health & Safety precautions. Mayor Smith
will get in touch with the Moontier.

Mayor Smith said that the sewage lines were
flushed out on September 21.

Councillor Ross moved for adjournment
