There was a meeting of the Stanley Village Council in the Council Chambers with Deputy Mayor Eric Mac Naughton in the chair until the Mayor arrived later.

The meeting opened with a prayer for Civic Authorities

The minutes were read and adopted on a motion by Councillor Hood, seconded by Councillor Loss.

\* Councillor Loss made the following motion:

The Mayor should be reimbursed \$25 for speaking engagements and \$15 for non speaking attendance for appearances he makes for public relations and that he receive \$35/mile as well for out of this area appearances. Councillor Hood seconded the motion. Carried.

Councillor Loss made the following motion  
The rate of a stipend be increased by \$20/mo for Mayor and Councillors starting January 1, 85.  
Councillor Hood seconded the motion. Carried

\* Mayor's report was read:

Since our August meeting I attended the Judges' Dinner on behalf of the Village where several dignitaries were on hand. Bob Howe, Dave Bishop Senator Charles McElman and Tom Everett former mayor and town manager of Woodstock. Now affiliated with the New Brunswick Fair Association. I spoke with Cpl. Ray Gauthier after the fair 17 illegal possessions 3 breathalyzer offenses gallons of booze poured out a good job of policing the fair - a message that I passed on to Staff Sgt. Fraser by telephone on the day after the fair. I feel those little "thank you's"

hopefully one day in the near future.

Agreement has been signed and returned for chip seal. Selva Lane and Jussel Lane have been prepared for surfacing. I will keep in touch with D. O. J for when crews are in the area.

Agrens Meetings started September 10 to continue on a regular basis. There is approximately \$7000 on hand with \$25000 in pledges. Grant applications are being discussed with Bob Howe and Dave Bishop.

An appropriate time to discuss the matter of my request for expenses would be in my absence. I have differentiated requested appearances as attending and speaking engagements. Some preparation is required for these. It is my feeling they portray the Village in a good light whether \* they warrant paying me I will leave with Council.

Councillor Loss moved that any other pay discussion be tabled till the next meeting. Councillor Hood seconded the motion. Carried.

The question of a short term loan for the Upper Nashua Bicentennial Committee should it go in debt over the Fall Festival was discussed. Council decided to meet any request by phone if it became necessary.

Councillor Loss made the motion that Council donate a piece of Culvert Stock to the Upper Nashua Bicentennial Committee. Councillor Hood seconded the motion. Carried.

Mayor Smith will get in touch with Darrel Manuel District Highway Engineer who told the clerk by phone that they could take no more orders for chip seal.

Councillor Hood has been talking to Mr. Smith about making speciality signs. He will make three signs for \$100-125. He will supply cedar

posts for \$15 each. We would like at least 2 Councilors to choose letters, etc. Council decided to let Councilor Wood choose. She should have a cost in writing before making a firm order and choose 2' x 4' or 4' x 4' whichever is suitable. Council prefer steel posts. Council suggested 1 ~~post~~ sign be set up at present time.

Eddie Barber is not well and can not fix Harrison Ave. Councilor tried to think of someone who would do jobs for the Village that Eddie used to do. Councilor Wood will see if Hugh Hogan is interested. Street sign for Harrison Ave should be straightened as well. What to pay for labor? Council decided \$3/hr for straight labor and \$3/hr. extra if a truck were used.

Council told Clerk to pay Dexter whatever he asks for his last job, but in future pay him \$8/hr. - the same as Phillip is to be paid.

It looks like Paul Green, Edison Palmer and Clifford Mac Kennon will be getting Sheriff's notices for unpaid Sewage Bills. Others have either paid or promised payment.

The question of pens came up. Councilor Mac Naughton suggested buy Stanley's coat of arms. Clerk was asked to ask I'don clerk how to proceed on this matter.
