

The meeting opened with a prayer for  
basic Authorities

The minutes were read and adopted on a  
motion from Councillor Hord seconded by Coun. Ross.  
Councillor Ross reported that dump barrels for the  
sanitaph should be in place next week.

Mayor Smith told Council that the schoolboard  
had no objections to a plaque acknowledging  
the name of the Bicentennial Coast and Field.  
Such a plaque will be placed inside a trophy cabinet  
at the school.

Work on a Village pen is not yet ready.

Jerry and Dieter did a good job clearing the storm sewers.  
Councillor Ross reported that he had made the  
welcoming speech for the July 1 parade on behalf of Mayor Smith.

A letter from the Dept. of Transportation, Traffic  
Engineering Branch was read regarding street signs.

It was moved by Councillor Ross, seconded by  
Councillor Hord that the Village purchase the blue  
flat bar signs (4.10 ft) and posts. Carried.

### Correspondence

A letter was read from the Provincial Municipal  
Council regarding surveying costs laws. Council  
accepted the explanation.

A letter was read from the Consumer and Corporate  
Affairs, Canada to the Stanley Board of Trade.  
Mayor Smith noted that although the Stanley Board  
of Trade is no longer active it is still registered.

A letter from the Minister of Transportation was read.  
It stated that \$40,000<sup>00</sup> would be spent on the  
Red Rock Road this summer.

A letter from Pierre de Forest, Computer Implementation  
Committee was read.

Capital Regional Development Committee's  
Annual Report was presented for reading.

Two posters from the Secretary of State regarding Youth Year were sent to Council. It was decided to give one to the Post Office and one to the library.

There is a suspected river seepage from the lagoon. Shelley is to meet with a member of the Dept. of Environment tomorrow.

Mayor Smith reported that Del Reidleder is Chairman of the Fredericton Waste Disposal Committee and he will keep in close touch with him regarding Stanley's role in the matter.

Councillor Hood reported that at the last Vella Board Meeting the board had decided to get vertical blinds instead of drapes. They approved of the Village's proposed college. The eye van was to be available to the guests on June 24. The Ambulance Drive netted \$2800<sup>00</sup> with six canvassers yet to report. Timi McWade is Vella representative for D.E.H. Board Meetings. Councillor Hood also reported that she had attended the Accreditation luncheon at the Vella and all seemed well.

Mayor Smith said that the police were now aware of the occupants of the brick house.

Mayor Smith will have the sand blasting and painting of the grating over the spillway of the lagoon attended to.
