

Thursday, May 16, 1985

There was a meeting of the Stanley Village Council held in the Council Chambers with Mayor J. William Smith in the chair.

The meeting opened with a prayer for Civic Authorities. The minutes of April 11 were read and adopted on a motion from Councillor Hood seconded by Councillor Ross.

The minutes of April 24 were read and adopted on a motion from Councillor Ross seconded by Councillor Hood.

Mayor Smith reported that Alvin Corbett was to sit on the regional assessment review board along with Angus Lawrence Garvey as Chairman.

The Highway Patrol posted a man to watch traffic on the corner. Mayor Smith explained to him that it was the side of the drugstore, not the front, that concerned Council.

Councillor Hood spoke to Judy about a few designs and she is now working on it.

Jim McWade is still not hooked up to the sewage. Councillor Ross made the motion that he be sent a letter telling him to hook up immediately or failing to do so he'll be hearing from the Department of Health.

Mayor Smith reported that the Agona will be situated more than 20 ft. from the slope of the ditch. Councillor Hood made the motion that the Village drop the proposed fee of \$100 for the Agona Building Permit. Coun. Ross ^(Carroll) seconded the motion. Councillor Ross moved that the Village give a lease to the Agona Committee for the rent property for as long as the Agona Association is an operating body. Councillor Hood seconded the motion. Carried.

Wayne Cleveland is working for Youth Protection so cannot work for the Village. Mark Logan name was suggested.

Mayor Smith had a call from the Telegraph Journal about payment for an ad about the Association of Villages Annual meeting. He agreed.

New Business A motion was made by Councillor Hood seconded by Councillor Mac Naughton that the Village order 300 Kalep bulbs at \$25/100 bulbs from the Canadian region which has a special rate for red bulbs to celebrate their diamond jubilee in 1986. Motion carried.

Mayor Smith read a letter from the Dept. of Communication regard a disc for I.V. to cover the whole area. Council decided to ask Reg Deans to read it and offer advice.

Operation Keep was read asking Council's support to the Scouting Committee.

A letter was read concerning donations for Stanley High School graduation. Councillor Ross made the motion that \$40⁰⁰ be given and \$20 each should be presented to the most improved students in Grades 10 & 11. Councillor Hood seconded the motion. Carried.

Mayor Smith reported that Angus was asked to represent this area for Crime Stoppers. It's a new program copied from Alberta. A new concept where rewards are given for information leading to crime solving. New Brunswick will have a provincial publicity campaign in August before which time there should be a public meeting in Stanley. Councillor Ross made the following motion. Council will support Crime Stoppers in principal and Angus should be paid out of pocket expenses for meeting. Village donation will be considered when asked for. Mayor Smith and Angus are to set up a meeting by invitation at their discretion to discuss the matter. Councillor Mac Naughton seconded the motion. Carried.

Councillor Ross reported that flyers from

Councillor Ross made the motion that a fire phone be installed at Stanley Foreman's and that the phone number 2299 be reserved for the fire phone when the new books are published. Councillor Hood seconded the motion. Carried.

Councillor Hood attended the Villa Board Meeting on May 7. A representative had asked for new drapes for the dining room. However so films could be shown. A generator had also been requested but it was thought cost would be out of bounds because Villa has electric heat. The annual meeting is June 26 @ ^{8.00}~~7.50~~ in Laura Cook School. Councillor Hood had attended a Trustee Conference in Saint John April 12 & 13 which was very informative & interesting. Dr. Wigners' hospital privileges were not renewed after April 30, 1985 and his privilege only patients he has at the Villa will continue until December 31, 1985.

Mayor Smith said that Edwin Brewer is the chairperson of the Lion's Club July 1 parade. Councillor Ross moved, seconded by Councillor Hood, that Council donate \$200⁰⁰ to the Lion's Club for this event. Motion carried.

Councillor Hood said that Minnie Jurek had asked for a street sign for her street. Council decided to do a survey of streets to see what needs to be done in the way of signs.
