

Thursday April 4, 1985

There was a special meeting of the Stanley Village Council held in the Council Chambers with Mayor J. William Smith presiding.

The meeting was held to discuss wages and salaries paid by Council.

The meeting opened with a prayer for Civic Authorities

The Clerk assured Council that \$6068.63/yr. is an excellent salary for the work expected to be done for clerking.

Phillip Campbell is paid 6098.40. On a motion from Councilor Rose, seconded by Councilor Bond it was decided to increase this amount by 5% retroactive to January 1, 1985 which would mean his present salary is 6403.32/yr. \*and he is to be paid for extra work\*

Clerk was asked to write Phillip a letter of explanation and to also state that Council deems it wise to pay workers with cheques dated the closest banking date to the fifteenth and thirty-first of the month.

\*if called away from regular working time \$8/hr. or at the rate of his regular pay if it is more. Carried

Furmen receive \$20 a fire call. After some discussion Councilor Rose made the motion that the matter be tabled until there is some input from the furmen themselves. Councilor Mac Naughton seconded the motion. Carried

Council decided casual labor should receive \$7/hr. and should apply to all casual labor except for mowing which is \$8/hr. since a person uses his own mower.
