

The minutes were read and adopted on a motion from Councillor Wood seconded by Councillor Ross.

Mayor Smith had been talking to Home Force about the spinning tires & harassment in the Village. Mr. Fournier was pleased about the two Village By-Laws recently enacted. As a consequence of this talk extra cars were put on patrol for 2 week ends. Eighty-five cars were stopped. There were 304 violations on alert testings, some liquor infractions and several minor infractions. Council realizes it's not been to the root of the problem but at least they were visible. Mr. Fournier advised that this same action will continue periodically.

Mayor Smith had a letter concerning the C.N.R. saying they had received his letter and saying that the Village would be required to pay all costs involved in any transaction. Councillor Brown also acknowledged receipt of his letter.

Well, dressing will resume in warmer weather.

Mayor Smith checked with Pat Flynn who said that \$40/hr was a reasonable rate for snow removal.

A letter was read from the Dept. of Justice explaining new laws for drinking drivers both provincially & Federally.

Councillor Wood complained about hostile drivers at the school during basketball games & dances when there are children in the school yard. She was asked to compose a letter on this subject to be sent to the Highway Patrol, the school principal & Dist. #9.

Letter from the Towns Municipal Council was read.

Road priorities for 1986 were discussed. These were listed as 1) Red Rock Road seal 2) Mike's Settlement Rd re-surf 3) R 107 off 20 re-surf.

Councillor Wood had samples of Village pens & spoons. Councillor Ross made the following motion: - That the Village accept this sample and order 1000 pens and 100 spoons and that Judy Bartlett be given a token of 50.00 for designing the pen. Councillor Wood seconded the motion. Carried.

Councillor Wood had pictures and negotiations for pictures for the Villa. Council chose 12. Maya Smith will look after it.

Councillor Wood reported that none of the applicants for head of the Villa were suitable so the Board is again advertising the job. She also reported that the Postcode Committee has planned 2 special lectures for "Time for Caring in life and living" (Jan 25 & 27) Consultants have been installed in the ambulance. There has been a request to set up a Diabetic Clinic in the Villa. Merlini Mac Naughton and Mrs. Melvin Anderson have been appointed to the board.

Councillor Ross reported that 2 Scott Airpaks had been bought by the Fire Department. The Dept. offered to pay 100⁰⁰ on the packs. Councillor Wood made the motion, seconded by Councillor Ross that Council give them back the cheque.
