

The meeting opened with a prayer followed by a hymn.

The minutes were read, corrected and approved, on a motion by Councilor Nord seconded by Coun. Bogusch.

Business Men. John Mac Bellway is no longer interested in serving on the board of the Capital Regional Development Commission. A letter from Stan Price explaining the situation as it stands was read. Mayor Smith will arrange a meeting with him.

The file was put on Coun. Bogusch's driveway.

A letter was read from Mr. Curbridge regarding traffic at the school. Coun. Bogusch made the motion, seconded by Coun. Nord that a 15 mph speed limit be posted at the road that leads to the school. Carried.

A post hole digger has been found & Phelps & Murray will put the street signs in soon.

Looking by the drug store was discussed.

Workers compensation - effective June 1, 1986
Volunteer Firemen will be covered while carrying out maintenance.

Coun. Bogusch had passed on ~~two~~ information about 2 car offenders to the Highway Patrol. They took action. Coun. Bogusch is thinking of having sheets with pertinent information at strategic spots and asking for information regarding infractions. Council approved this idea.

Dogs. The wording in the minutes of May 15 regarding dogs sounded pretty harsh so Coun. Bogusch wrote a much more tactful letter saying the same thing and made the motion that further to the motion of the previous meeting this letter be distributed to the citizens. Coun. Nord seconded the motion. Carried.

Ballistic Board. Coun. Bogusch had a draft for it and had an estimate of the cost. There followed

Old Business

Mayor Smith reported that Mr. Hawley had water problems on his property because of the well at the Fire Hall. It has been fixed.

The Mayor also mentioned the height of the grass behind the Post office on the land that was seeded last year. Coun. Mac Naughton said he'd look ^{it} after and keep it mowed.

Mayor Smith reported that four people from the Irish Theon Co had approached him regarding a sewage system. The guidelines are now different from what they were in 1979. They are now 110ft between hook ups for a cost of \$4000. Mayor Smith is looking at guidelines and answers for them from Municipal Affairs and Council and ~~&~~ Ass.

Coun. Hood made the motion that Council get in touch with the Department of Transportation to have the ditch in Silva Lane and the water problem at the Ogona fixed as soon as possible.

Coun. Bogesch seconded the motion. Carried.

Roger Moore road complaint is an asphalt problem. Mayor Smith will see Eule Hervey about it.

Councillor Bogesch had been studying the By-laws and explained to Council his sheets of By-laws in relation to the minutes & went over the minutes. He also volunteered to do more work on the By-Laws

letters of congratulation on the election were read from Mr. Jackson and Opposition leader Frank Mac Kenna.

A letter from the Board of Directors of the Upper Nashuaak Aguna Association was read. It asked that the Council pay for ^{the Power Bill} ~~lights and~~ ~~put~~ in the operation of Aguna. Councillor Bogusch ^{suggested} that a letter of reply say that Council is giving the matter consideration.

Councillor Hood reported on a Village Board meeting of June 10. She said the Staff intended to put Village donated pictures on the wall permanently. A discussion followed & Council had a few suggestions how they could be hung so that they could be moved around.

Councillor Hood also attended a June 11 Mass on Wheels meeting as well as an Open House at the Village on June 12.

Councillor Bogusch moved for adjournment.
