Thursday, May 15, 1986

There was a meeting of the Stanley Village Council in the Council Chamber with Mayor J. William Smith in the chair.

The meeting opened with a prayer for Civic Authorities.

Mayor J. William Smith, Councillor Bernard Bogusch, Councillor Freda Hord and Councillor Carl Mac Naughton all took the oath of office.

The minutes were read and approved on a motion from Councillor Hord seconded by Councillor Mac Naughton.

A letter from D. Peter Foster was read. It concerned Sewage Easements and Surveys.

There was discussion about C.D. property outside Village limits. Mayor Smith had been asked if the Village would be interested. The answer was "No".

Wpku's compensation will cover Volunteer firemen to and from fires and during fires but not for any related duties. Through the Association of Villages this is hoped to be remedied. The question also arose as to what an unemployed fireman's compensation would be based on.

Three weeks ago Mayor Smith passed ~~three~~ <sup>four</sup> statements on tire squealers to the Highway Patrol. They were acted on and \$10 fines and loss of points were given. There seems to be less squealing lately.

A thank you letter from Ms. Weeks was read.

A letter asking for money for High School graduation was read. Councillor Hord made

certificate plus a letter of congratulation to be sent to Phillip Currier.

Letter from the Department of Supply and Services was read regarding purchases for municipalities.

Councillor Bogish made the motion that Village buy a copy of "Petroleum on Tap" from the Conservation Council for \$<sup>8.00</sup>. Councillor Hess seconded the motion. Carried.

A letter from Mini Rogan was read regarding dogs. Councillor Bogish made the following motion seconded by Councillor Mac Naughton.

A flyer will be sent to all Village citizens stating  
1) The Village has a By-law stating that a dog is not to be at large 2) The Village has engaged a part time dogcatcher. 3) If a dog is picked up an impounded dog could cost up to \$75<sup>00</sup> to be released from the pound. 4) There is also an unnecessary noise By-law which prohibits dogs being allowed to bark outside at night. Motion Carried.

Capital Regional Development Commission Annual meeting will be September 10, 1986 in Fredericton.

Plans were made to attend the Association of Villages Annual Meeting in Clame, N.B.

Give a shot don't pollute is the slogan of the Owl Anti littering Campaign. Village was asked to cooperate.

Letter was read from the Department of Tourism regarding a Recreation Council meeting.

A letter from the Department of Tourism was read regarding a Minister's Award for community service.

Councillor Bogish inquired about the rest of

what was Harry McAlone's old circular driveway. Council was in agreement that 2 loads of topsoil should be supplied.

Councillor Hood reported on a Tree meeting she had attended May 6.

There was a discussion about unfenced swimming pools.

Councillor Hood had had a letter from Mr. Burridge asking that the Council put a 15 m.p.h. speed <sup>limit</sup> sign on the road going to the school. Council decided this would be ineffective and that other arrangements should be made.

Councillor Hood had had complaints about the condition of the <sup>old dump</sup> beside the Curling Club and the mess it is in. Council has complained before and nothing has been done about it.

Councillor Hood made the motion, seconded by Councillor Byrnes that Council proceed with plans to build a Community Bulletin board. Location and appearance of it were discussed.

Councillor Hood moved for adjournment.
