

Thursday March 12, 1987

There was a meeting of the Stanley Village Council was held in the Council Chamber with Mayor J. Wm. Smith in the Chair.

The meeting opened with a prayer for lewice Authorities.

Councillor MacNaughton approved the circulated minutes seconded by Councillor Hood.

Before the meeting 3 applicants were interviewed for the position of Village Clerk. After some discussion, Councillor Hood made the motion, seconded by Councillor Boguski that Anna Linnock be given the position of clerk. Carried.

Mayor Smith said that a house ^{assessed} ~~valued~~ at \$50,000 would pay for sewage collection but those that were assessed lower would cost the Village money. Discussion followed regarding price of collection for places like the school, Villa, restaurant and Bourgeois' store. Mayor Smith and Councillor Boguski will do some work on it.

Irving property and unsightly premises were discussed. Councillor MacNaughton suggested that unsightly premises all over the Village, including Walter Selick's property. Council decided to table the situation.

Mayor Smith had the material ready to present to the Minister of Municipal Affairs and Environment to ask for sewage development to the end of the

Development officer and it was read to Council.
A letter was read regarding sending a student
to a safety seminar. Councillor Hood made the
motion that the Village sponsor one student.
Councillor Bogesch seconded the motion Carried.

Councillor Hood gave a report on a Village
Board Meeting which took place March 3.

There is a broken window at the library.
Doug Hood will fix it.

Councillor Hood suggested that the road
signs that say "Welcome to Stanley" should
be looked at in the spring with new paint
jobs in mind.

Stimulation Grant for 1987 was discussed.
It was decided to ask for money to fix
sidewalks, pave the Ward Settlement Road
and ditch Harrison Ave.

Councillor Bogesch moved for
adjournment
