At present, they are negotiating with NB Tel. Outreach programs are carrying on as usual, and they are still trying to obtain a physiotherapist.	n/a
6	Smith	<u>Lease Agreement with Stanley Mutual</u> - should be available for signatures by next meeting.	n/a
7	Bogisch	<u>Application CRTC</u> - Mayor spoke with a contact at the Exhibition and he stated that Stanley would be getting CABLE in the Spring of 1989. Councillor Bogisch reported being into the office, and they advised him that they are presently working in Gagetown, and Stanley were supposed to be next in line.	
8	Smith	<u>Storm Sewers</u> - Mayor had recently spoken with Mr. Johnstone over the problem. Council agreed to have Clerk send letters to both Mr. Johnstone and The Upper Nashwaak Agrena Association advising them that if they would be willing to do something from the flow off the hill, i.e., putting a surface drain over to the brook, Council would do whatever they could to accommodate the flow under the road. If all parties would cooperate, this would alleviate the problem greatly.	Clerk

- 9 Smith Anglican Church Hall - Mayor reported that Wayne Cleveland would not be able to demolish the building until possibly mid-winter, so, when Mr. Ken Osmond from Burtt's Corner contacted him concerning same, Mayor consented to such and had an Agreement drawn up between Village and Mr. Osmond, requesting that Mr. Osmond make a \$400.00 DEPOSIT towards the job, and agreeing to a complete clean-up after building is torn down. The deposit to be returned to Mr. Osmond upon completion, of course. He signed the Agreement and left us with a copy, which was circulated amongst Council. n/a
- 10 Smith N.B. Highway Patrol - Councillor Bogisch read a letter that he had written to Sgt. Marche expressing our appreciation over the years. ^{to Council} n/a
- 11 Smith Letter From Mary O'Hara - Councillor MacNaughton suggested that Council engage a contractor to rectify this problem. He was appointed at this time to follow this up. Council discussed the probability of who might be contacted to do the job, Mr. Pat Flynn or Mr. Doug MacDonald. It was agreed that we try to be fair when allotting projects, that is, if Mr. Flynn performed the last job, then we should contact Mr. MacDonald this time. Councillor MacNaughton to report progress at next meeting. E.M.N.
- 12 Smith CN Property - Mayor Smith read to Council a letter that was sent to those property owners of land on the Irishtown Road, reporting to them that we will be advising of our offer of sale. n/a
- 13 Bogisch Introduction of Draft Amendment - Sewage By-Law - Councillor Bogisch reported to Council his suggestions for a Notice to be displayed to citizens concerning the possible changes in sewage rates. He agreed to draft the notice and present it at next Council Meeting. It was also suggested that with January's billing, a note be included with the billing to user's whose rate has changed, advising them that if they feel it is not just, they may contact Council in writing with their arguments, that is to make a representation to Council.
On September 15, 1988, Village By-Law #20A had first reading in its entirety, and again on September 15, 1988, Village By-Law #20A had second reading in its entirety.
Clerk reported at this time that she had received payment in full from Social Assistance for Edison Palmer's sewage account. n/a
- 14 Smith Pumping Stations - Clerk reported that she had contacted Phillip Campbell to do the painting. n/a
- 15 Smith Lagoon - Mayor investigated the pipe in question, and found that it is not a problem; outlet pipe is just shortened up. n/a
- 16 Smith Culverts - Mrs. Peggy Anderson had paid her bill for the cost of her culverts. n/a


- 17 Smith Video - "Local Government" - has now been circulated to Councillor Bogisch for viewing. Councillor Freda Hood reported that there seemed to be a problem with the film, so Mr. Bogisch will check it out. n/a
- 18 Smith Building Inspector - we have heard nothing further from Mr. Forbes re same. Council are going to look into a possible payment of fees to Mr. Angus Sansom for recognition of his services. n/a
- 19 Hood Fallen Tree at Corner by McWade's - it was reported that this problem has been very slowly remedied. Councillor Bogisch suggested that we should have someone to look after such things as this and others, such as the overflowing Garbage Tins at Cenotaph, etc. Mayor Smith will look after the mess of trees over at Harrison St. tomorrow. Smith
- 20 Smith Request From Mary Hay - Mayor Smith spoke with her and tried to make her understand that it was not a problem of the Village. n/a
- 20 Smith Picture Frames - Mr. Moss has made two frames for us this time, one of which is displayed on the wall with the recent picture of the present Village Council. n/a
- 21 Smith Fire Hall - Mayor Smith reported that the roof on the Fire Hall has been recently spray-painted, at a cost of \$650.00 which has been paid. n/a
- 22 Smith Underground Storage Tank Disposal Site - Mayor Smith advised Council that Mr. Doug MacDonald is now in the business of digging up and removing underground storage tanks, and he is also responsible for proper disposal of them. The only disposal site in the Province is in Moncton. He requested the stipulations for such a site, and asked Environment to consider his proposed site next to the Government Garage on Irishtown Road. He also requested of Village Council a letter of approval which is one of the requirements in issuing him a license to do such. At this time, Environment still haven't responded with their acceptance of the site.
Council agreed that they would not be in favour of this site at this time, and would require further necessary consultation. n/a
- 23 Smith Library Matters - Mayor presented a bill from Mr. Heggie for a new lock which was installed at Library. He also presented Mr. Heggie's request for funds to assist in a gift for Mrs. Henderson, as she is retiring, and the party is to be held September 30/88. Mayor asked him what the procedure would be in obtaining a replacement for her position, and Mr. Heggie advised that it would be publicly announced, and a Selection Committee would make the decision.
MOTION: That Village Council forward \$50.00 to The Library Group for a retirement gift for Mrs. Henderson.

- 24 Hood Street Sign - Harrison Avenue - she reported that it is now in the ditch. Clerk was instructed to contact Phillip Campbell to re-install the signs, Harrison Avenue, Water Street, and Riverview, and anchor them with a "T". The new posts and letters are at Fire Hall for the signs. Clerk
- 25 Bogisch Traffic Sign - he reported on the sign by Roger Moore's advising that he had written to G. Goguen of Dept. of Transp. and that it was eventually replaced and later securely anchored. It is now down again after the accident yesterday. B.G.B.
- 26 Bogisch Sign At Top Of Hill - Councillor Bogisch drove out to Cross Creek and commented that the 50KPH is very close to the Church in Stanley, and suggested that it should be moved further back; also that the sign advising of a turn should be moved back. He will contact G. Goguen of Dept. of Transp. and request a new sign "Trucks - Gear Down" or something to that effect to serve as a proper warning to truckers who are new to the area. B.G.B.
- 27 Smith Terry Fox Run - September 18, 1988 - at 1:00 p.m. Mayor advised that Mr. Roger Moore had consulted him concerning our possibility of donating funds, and asked if Mr. Smith could be present to give an official commencement of the Run. He is not available on that day, so Councillor Hood will do the honours. MOTION: That Council donate \$100.00 towards the Terry Fox Run. Motion: B. G. Bogisch/ E. MacNaughton Clerk
- 28 Smith Letter From Canada Trust - concerning banking policies was presented to Council. It was agreed that Mayor Smith and the Clerk would follow up on this issue. Smith & Clerk
- 29 Smith Thank You Note - from Mrs. Sandra MacBean for Village Pins she had obtained when travelling to Ontario to C.G.I.T. Camp. n/a
- 29 Smith Letter - Capital Region Development - was circulated amongst Council which advised of a new revised budget. n/a
- 30 Smith Letter - N.B. Municipal Finance Corp. - offering financial assistance towards any requirements we might have. Clerk instructed to acknowledge this letter and advise that we do not foresee having to call upon them for financial requirements. Clerk
- 31 Smith Letter From Jennifer Griffiths, Land Use Planning Branch - advising us of Seminars to be held on By-Law's, etc. on October 24th, 25th, and 26th, 1988. It was circulated to Council, and they were urged to attend if possible. n/a
