MINUTES

The Special Meeting concerning the Sewage By-Law opened with the Prayer For Civic Authorities.

Mayor Smith mentioned two extra items to be discussed, other than the Sewage By-Law, and Council decided to discuss same following the completion of discussion on the Sewage By-Law. These two extra items were:

- 1) A possible donation to the Upper Nashwaak Agrena Association; and
- 2) Request For Culverts - by Lynwood & Peggy Anderson & Donald Dionne.

Councillor Bogisch guided Council through the By-Law, indicating where he had suggested changes, when he comprised the draft amendment of the By-Law. Council were, on the whole, in agreement of the amendment (excluding Schedule A) and decided on a few changes, those being:

Section 4 - Permits f. (1)

For work mentioned in clause (1) of Subsection b. of Section 2., such work shall be performed by the VSI or a qualified and duly licensed person delegated by him; and

Addition of Section 14

The VSI is "the By-Law Enforcing Officer" authorized to enforce the provisions contained in this By-Law.

A definite agreement of Schedule A (identifiable classes of user units suitable for distinguishable rates involving billings) was not reached at this time, and Mayor Smith and Councillor Bogisch are to meet tomorrow (Friday AM, July 29, 1988 around 11:30) to further discuss same and are going to contact other Village Offices, preferably Blackville and Doaktown) requesting if they could assist us in our fee structure by allowing us to view their fee schedule for sewage rates.

MOTION: Mayor Smith and Councillor Bogisch to meet in Village Office on July 29, 1988 to do more research into the fee structure of sewage rates of another municipality.

Upper Nashwaak Agrena Association - Mayor Smith reported that Mr. Paul Mahar had contacted him re necessity of grade work being done. Mayor instructed him to prepare something in writing which we have not received as yet.

Mayor presented to Council the Agrena's need for funds at this time, as they have received a Grant for 2 employees for the summer, but do not, at this time, have sufficient funds to supply them with materials to work with.

MOTION: That Village Council allocate \$1,500.00 to the Upper Nashwaak Agrena Association for recreational purposes ONLY and further request the Association to furnish Council with an accounting of expenditures of these funds by October 31, 1988, prior to our budget date of November 1988. (This accounting does not have to be exact) Clerk instructed to refer to Paragraph 1 (b) in letter of September 12, 1986 when sending cheque and letter to the Agrena Association.

MOTION: B. Bogisch; F. Hood.

Village Property Sewage Hook-Up's - Mayor reported to Council that the Clerk had contacted our Accountant to ask him if we should be issuing billings for our own property with hook-up's (Library, Fire Hall, Anglican Church Hall), and he advised that we should be billing Sewage Acct. but to wait until the first of the New Year 1989.

Phillip Campbell - Mayor advised Council that he is away on vacation, and that keys for Pumping Station are at Vincent Campbell's, and Tracy Campbell has access to them. Phillip suggested Stan Foreman be contacted if problems arise.

Culverts - Mayor had been in contact with Peggy Anderson who requested a new culvert above her driveway, and also a new culvert for her son-in-law (Donald Dionne) who is building on her property. It was agreed that Pat Flynn commence work as soon as possible.

VIDEO- Assoc. of Municipal Administrators of N.B. - Mayor read to Council a letter that we had received from them making us aware of the VIDEO, and he also read our letters to Mayor Benson Parker of Doaktown and Mayor Roland Walls of Blackville in which we asked if they would be willing to cost-share the purchase of one of these VIDEO'S.



Mayor also discussed same with Peter Forbes, advised him to have Dale MacFarlane survey the entire property, and if Mr. McCoy is still not in agreement to buy, Village will retain it. Mr. Ronald Ashfield is Mr. McCoy's solicitor.
